Clarke part of officiating crew during AHL contest

A very historic season continued for Alex Clarke as the official with local roots refereed her first American Hockey League game at Abbotsford Centre. Clarke who became the first woman ever to referee a Canadian Hockey League and Western Hockey League game during the 2021-'22 season was on the ice Dec. 5 as the Abbotsford Canucks met the San Jose Barracuda.

Named to both the Western Hockey League and AHL's officiating teams for the year, Clarke (nee Blair) who grew up on a farm near Drake said in an article in the Nov. 1 edition of the Lanigan Advisor that the theme for this year has been grateful. "I think more than anything though I am just excited to see the opportunities come and to hopefully give them my best foot forward."

Up until this season no woman had ever been selected to officiate in either league but rewind a few months ago and Clarke not only was part of a WHL contest but now she has checked off a game in the AHL as well. Joining nine other female referees and linespeople as part of the 2021-'22 AHL crew, Clarke said in the Nov. 1 edition of the Advisor, "For me it is rewarding to feel like I've earned it. There are a lot of people right now who think in the WHL I am just a token female or in the AHL that think that the 10 of us are just token females. I think it is rewarding to be able to feel and stand on my feet and say that I think that I've earned this opportunity and I don't think that it is coming to me as a gender thing. I feel like they've recognized and seen me and I am qualified to be there."

As Clarke made her AHL debut in Abbotsford, B.C., many people took to Twitter to express their congratulations.

With a photo of Clarke, the AHL tweeted: "Welcome to the American Hockey League, Alexandra Clarke!"

The Abbotsford Canucks tweeted: "Alexandra Clarke refereed her first AHL game tonight at Abbotsford Centre. She is also the first female AHL referee to work a game this season at Abbotsford Centre. Great job tonight and congrats, Alexandra."

Back home Alex's dad Trevor tweeted: "Another extremely proud moment for this Dad! Way to go Alex!"

The Drake Canucks senior hockey team shared its well wishes, tweeting: "Another incredible accomplishment for one of Drake's own! Congratulations Alex!"

And closer to where Alex now resides, the SJHL's Weyburn Red Wings sent out a tweet: "Congratulations everyone, especially our very own Alex Clarke from the entire Weyburn Red Wings organization and community!! Keep doing great things!"

Over the years Clarke has certainly put in the work to get to where she is at, officiating at a number of high level events including being assigned to the 2020 IIHF Women's World Championship, the 2019 IIHF Women's World Championship (Division 1, Group B), the 2018 4 Nations Cup, and the 2018 IIHF U18 Women's World Championship (Division II, Group B). She has also been on the ice in the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League; the Saskatchewan Female U18 AAA League; U SPORTS Women's Hockey; the Saskatchewan Male U18 AAA League; and the Prairie Junior Hockey League.

Most recently, after officiating some games in the WHL, Clarke headed to Denmark and the Czech Republic to try out at an officiating camp and qualification tournament in an effort to make the roster for the upcoming Olympics in Beijing. As

RCMP Report

Catalytic converters stolen in Watrous

On the night of Dec. 2 between 5 p.m. and 9 a.m., two catalytic converters were stolen from trucks on Melron Services property. In early November, catalytic converters were also stolen off of vehicles parked in the Centennial Ford parking lot. Watrous RCMP is seeking assistance in regards to any information regarding either incident. All information can be given to Watrous RCMP, or anonymously through Crime Stoppers Saskatchewan.

Vehicle collision south of Tribune

On Friday, Dec. 3 at approximately 12:33 p.m., Weyburn RCMP responded to reports of a collision between a semi and a piece of farm machinery on Hwy. 35, approximately four kilometres south of Tribune.

Initial investigation determined that the farm machinery struck the rear portion of the semi while travelling south bound. The collision caused the farm machinery to tip onto its side, blocking the highway in both directions.

STARS Air Ambulance attended and airlifted the adult male driver of the farm machinery to hospital with what were described as being serious injuries. The adult female driver of the semi did not report any injuries.

Hwy. 35 was blocked for several hours. The highway was later cleared of all debris and reopened to traffic travelling in both directions.

Collision north of Davidson

On Monday, Dec. 6 at approximately 2:08 a.m., Craik RCMP responded to a serious vehicle collision involving two semi trucks with trailers approximately 10 kilometres north of Davidson.

Initial investigation determined a northbound semi tractor-trailer unit jack-knifed on Hwy. 11 and a second northbound semi travelling behind the first collided with it.

Hanley woman charged

On Dec. 2 Saskatchewan RCMP's Saskatoon Crime Reduction Team arrested a woman in relation to a Controlled Drug and Substance Act investigation in the Hanley area.

The investigation determined cocaine was being trafficked out of a local business in Hanley by an adult female employee. It is not believed anyone else at the business was involved and no one else at the business was aware the drug trafficking was occurring.

Randi Mallett of Hanley is charged with: two counts, trafficking (cocaine), Section 5(1), Controlled Drugs and Substances Act and two counts, possession of the proceeds of crime less than \$5,000, Section 354(1)(a) and 355(b), Criminal Code.

She will appear in Saskatoon Provincial Court on Feb. 22 at 2 p.m.



— tips from Reena Nerbas

Dear Reena,
To deter birds from flying into my patio windows I put decals on the windows. I took the decals off and they have left sticky goo which I cannot remove. Do you have any advice? Anne

Dear Anne,
Your best bet is to wash the sticky residue with a non-scratching abrasive cloth, hot water and dish soap. The hot water will loosen the glue. Clean your windows as normal after the residue is gone.

Dear Reena,
In order to meet the recycling standards, I was removing a large label from paper towel packaging. I got it off in one swift rip, which was fantastic, until it landed flat on the concrete floor. I finished unloading the paper towels and by the time I got to the label, it was flush. I was able to peel off a few bits, but they were coming off in bits. I stopped, as I felt this would not help. Now I am left with a foot-long mess on the concrete. Thoughts? Hoping to avoid heavy-duty chemicals. Thought maybe a rag soaked in vinegar might work? Kind regards, Lexi

Dear Lexi,
Hot water and a stiff plastic scraper should be all you need in order to remove the sticker. A hot hair dryer is another option or pour rubbing alcohol onto the area and gently scrape.

Hi Reena,
I would like to know how to clean a badly burned ceramic stove top. My daughters have made eggs and not cleaned the stove top properly and it is impossible to clean. I have used the glass top cleaner and scraper but am unable to get the burned spots off. Thanks, Laurel

Dear Laurel,

Years ago, a contributor shared the same challenge. She sprayed the stove with oven cleaner and scrubbed. She said the stove looked brand new (test on an inconspicuous area first).

Feedback from wise contributor

Re: Peeling garlic

Hi Reena,

I was reading your column about a tip for removing the peel from garlic cloves. I have the following tip - microwave a clove or two on high for about five seconds then cut off the end and the peel will just slide off! Thanks, Christine

Use these tips with a grain of salt

- Pour half a cup of table salt into your kitchen/bathroom drain and garburator. Doing this quick exercise once a month will freshen the drain and get rid of stinky pipes. Submitted by: Mark

- To quickly chill a bottle of wine, place the bottle in an ice bucket. Add a layer of ice on the bottom and sprinkle it with a few tablespoons of table salt. Continue to layer salt and ice until it reaches the neck of the bottle. Then add water to ice level. After 10 minutes, open and serve. Rinse the ice bucket thoroughly after use. Submitted by: Mark

- Before winter I maintain my metal tools and bicycle parts by cleaning them with a paste of salt and lemon juice. This prevents future rust buildup. Submitted by: Mark

- Get rid of bitter coffee by adding a pinch of table salt to the fresh coffee grounds before running coffee through the machine. Submitted by: Aileen

- Remove odours from hands and cutting boards by rubbing them with lemon juice and salt. Rinse with water. Submitted by: Aileen

Pirates cash in against Monarchs

With a win at home against Watrous to wrap up November, the Lanigan Pirates were hoping to hit December with some momentum.

Taking a 10-4 victory at home against the Winterhawks Nov. 26, the Pirates headed to Foam Lake to face the Flyers Dec. 3 before returning home to meeting Wynyard Dec. 4.

In the Dec. 3 contest, Lanigan went with Mack Shields in net and with the power play struck first as Austin Calladine scored from Dexter Bricker and Elliott Peterson. Back to even strength, Lanigan increased its advantage to two as Calladine notched his second of the game with 11:39 left in period one. However, Foam Lake would respond with a power play of its own as the Flyers made it 2-1 with 2:24 to go. That was followed up with a Travis Mayan equalizer to make it 2-2 with 53 seconds remaining in period one. Looking to get back in front, Lanigan pressed and less than 10 seconds later, Korwin Shewchuk put the Pirates up 3-2 with assists going to Trey Daelick and Stuart

Symenuk.

Taking a lead into the second period, Lanigan looked to continue to push ahead but it would be Foam Lake who struck first. With 18:46 remaining in period two, the Flyers made it 3-3 but as was the case earlier in the contest, Lanigan fought back and Peterson who had a helper earlier notched a goal to give the Pirates a 4-3 lead. That advantage which came with 4:58 to go in period two lasted until 4:09 remaining when Foam Lake once again tied the game as Mayan notched his second of the game. That was it for scoring through 40 minutes as both clubs looked to try and get the go-ahead goal.

With the power play and early in period three, Foam Lake would get a 5-4 lead as Mayan scored his third of the contest and that would be it as the Flyers took a 5-4 victory on home ice.

Despite the close loss, Lanigan returned to the ice at home Dec. 4 as they faced Wynyard. With a goal against the Flyers, Peterson carried that momentum over and




