## Fall sitting of the Legislature wraps up

With the fall sitting of the Legislature concluding, the Government of Saskatchewan highlighted the significant progress that has been made on priorities identified in the Throne Speech. According to the provincial government, key initiatives this fall included providing affordability relief, investments in health care recruitment and retention, new initiatives to make communities safer and standing up for Saskatchewan's economic autonomy with the introduction of the Saskatchewan First Act.

Thanks to higher than expected natural resource revenue, the government was able to announce significant measures to tackle affordability challenges facing Saskatchewan residents. The plan provides a \$500 Affordability Tax Credit cheque for everyone 18 and above, retiring \$1 billion in operating debt, extending the small business tax rate reduction and cancelling a previously announced PST expansion.

"A strong economy is what has allowed us to invest in affordability relief," Deputy Premier and Minister of Finance Donna Harpauer said. "We will continue to stand up for and promote Saskatchewan, because a growing economy is what allows us to make key investments in health care, education and social services."

These measures, along with some of the lowest utility costs and income tax levels in the country, have helped Saskatchewan residents weather the challenges of inflation and interest rate hikes.

Saskatchewan is also seeing success on the Health Human Resources (HHR) action plan to recruit, train, incentivize and retain health care professionals. As part of active recruitment efforts, a delegation recently travelled to Manila, Philippines, to recruit and promote Saskatchewan's health care employment opportunities. To date, 161 job offers have been made to Filipino health care workers to join Saskatchewan's health care system.

"We know there are serious health care staffing challenges, but our plan is producing results," Health Minister Paul Merriman said. "We received interest from more than 1,200 Filipino health care workers and we made 129 job offers while we were in Manila which will help to stabilize health services across the province and build a stronger health care workforce."

Finally, this fall sitting also saw the introduction of the Saskatchewan First Act which will confirm exclusive jurisdiction over natural resources and defend our provincial economic autonomy.

"A strong Saskatchewan means a strong Canada," Minister of Justice and Attorney General Bronwyn Eyre said. "We are not going to be shy about asserting our economic autonomy and we are going to stand up and defend Saskatchewan against policies that hurt our economy."

The Act will also create an Economic Impact Assessment Tribunal that will define, quantify and report on the economic (see page two: **LEGISLATURE**)

repercussions of federal initiatives on provincial investment and Saskatchewan projects, businesses and people.

"I'd like to thank all members on both sides of the house for their unanimous support of government priorities this session," Premier Scott Moe said. "Specifically, the second reading of the Saskatchewan First Act, the motion in defence of law-abiding firearms owners and the affordability tax credit cheque legislation."

On the last day of the fall session, Official Opposition Leader Carla Beck called to question the Sask. Party government on their failures to fix the health system and the affordability crisis.

"Saskatchewan has so much potential, and the Sask. Party is holding us back," said Beck. "Hospitals are closing, hard-working families are struggling to put food on the table, and instead of fixing these issues, the Sask. Party closed profitable liquor stores and poured taxpayer dollars into a redundant police force and a costly new tax system. Saskatchewan people can't afford to keep paying for Scott

Moe's mistakes."

The Official Opposition called on Scott Moe's Sask. Party government throughout the fall session to address Saskatchewan's national-leading rates of economic anxiety and uncertainty by: investigating grocery and meat prices; expanding \$500 affordability cheques for parents with children; creating a consumer advocate for fair and reliable utilities; rolling back the eight percent SaskPower and 23 percent SaskEnergy increases; rolling back the PST expansion; and suspending the provincial gas tax.

The NDP stated the government also failed to put forward a serious plan for health care, despite sitting on billions of dollars in windfall resource revenues and the Provincial Auditor finding that the government's health plan is inadequate. "The fall sitting may be ending but the Saskatchewan NDP remain as committed as ever to making life more affordable, strengthening our hospitals and creating good, mortgage-paying jobs that people can be proud of."

## Report of assault in Weyakwin

At approximately 1:30 p.m. Dec. 7, Waskesiu RCMP received a report of an assault with a weapon in Weyakwin. An adult male sustained serious but non-life-threatening injuries in the incident. At approximately 3 p.m., La Ronge RCMP received a report that a truck suspected to be connected to this assault was travelling into their detachment area. Officers began patrolling the area and at approximately 4 p.m., located the truck in La Ronge. They attempted a traffic stop. The truck did not stop and officers pursued it. A spike belt was set up at the intersection of Riese Drive and Hwy. 102. The truck drove over it and rammed into an unoccupied police vehicle, causing significant damage. The truck continued driving with a flat tire. Officers were able to manoeuvre the truck off the road and the driver was arrested without incident. One police officer reported non-life-threatening injuries from these events. Further investigation determined the truck had been reported as stolen from Sucker River on Dec. 6, 2022.

As a result of investigation, John Sanderson, 34, of Bell's Point, is charged with single counts of: flight from police, Section 320.17, Criminal Code; possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose, Section 88(2), Criminal Code; possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000, Section 354(1)(a), Criminal Code; assault on police officer causing bodily harm, Section 270.01(2), Criminal Code; mischief over \$5,000, Section 430(3), Criminal Code; and operation while impaired, Section 320.14(1)(a), Criminal Code.

Montreal Lake RCMP continue to investigate the assault in Weyakwin. Anyone with information should call Montreal Lake RCMP at 306-663-4420. ## Robbery in Nipawin

At approximately 4:30 p.m. Dec. 8, Nipawin RCMP

received several reports of a robbery at a business on the 600 block of Nipawin Road East in Nipawin.

Initial investigation determined a masked male entered the business and pointed a firearm at occupants. The occupants secured the male and took the firearm from him. Nipawin RCMP arrived immediately and arrested the male without incident.

Robert McKay, 25, of Shoal Lake, is charged with single counts of: robbery with firearm, Section 344, Criminal Code; pointing a firearm, Section 87(2), Criminal Code; wear a disguise with intent, Section 351(2), Criminal Code; possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose, Section 88(2), Criminal Code; possession of a weapon contrary to order, Section 117.01(3), Criminal Code; possession of a restricted firearm/prohibited weapon without license/registration, Section 95(2), Criminal Code; careless use of a firearm, Section 91(3), Criminal Code; unauthorized possession of a firearm/prohibited weapon, Section 91(3), Criminal Code; and fail to comply with probation order, Section 733.1(1), Criminal Code.

## Break and enter at gas station

At approximately 3:40 am Dec. 9, Greenwater RCMP were called to Archerwill for a break and enter at the gas station.

Police investigation determined four individuals stole a large quantity of alcohol and food. The four individuals were travelling in a blue four-door pickup truck believed to be a Ford F-150. The truck was located later on the morning of Dec. 9, 2022, on Kinistin Saulteaux Nation. The suspects are still at large.

Suspect one wore a black hooded jacket, black pants and black boots. Suspect two wore a grey hooded sweater, black pants and white shoes. Suspect three wore a black baseball cap with a white symbol on the front, a dark green-grey jacket with fur on the hood, light pants and black boots. Suspect four wore a black baseball cap, black jacket, black pants and white running shoes.

## Collision north of Lloydminster

At approximately 12:05 p.m., Dec. 9 Maidstone RCMP received a report of a collision on Hwy. 17, approximately 10 kilometres north of Lloydminster. Initial investigation determined a northbound pickup truck and a southbound

SUV collided. The driver of the SUV, a 20-year-old female from Tulliby Lake, Alta., passed away at the scene. Her family has been notified. The adult male driver of the pickup truck was taken to hospital with injuries described as serious. Hwy. 17 was closed for approximately nine hours for initial investigation. Maidstone RCMP continues to investigate with the assistance of a Saskatchewan RCMP Collision Reconstructionist.

## Armed robbery in Eastend

At approximately 3:30 p.m. Dec. 10, Shaunavon RCMP received a report of an armed robbery at a business in the town of Eastend. An employee reported that a male filled up his vehicle with fuel, then attempted to leave without paying. The employee exited the business and the male pointed a firearm at him before fleeing the scene.

Shaunavon RCMP officers located the suspect vehicle at a residence a short time later in Eastend. With the assistance of a conservation officer with the Provincial Protective Services Branch, RCMP officers were able to get the suspect to exit the residence and he was arrested without incident. A rifle believed to be have been pointed at the victim and a semi-automatic firearm were recovered and seized by police at the time of the arrest.

Thirty-eight-year-old Adam Kormendy has been charged with a number of firearms-related offences, including: one count, robbery using a firearm, Section 344(1)(a.1), Criminal Code; one count, pointing a firearm, Section 87, Criminal Code; one count, possessing a weapon for a dangerous purpose, Section 88, Criminal Code; two counts, unauthorized possession of a firearm, Section 92(1), Criminal Code; and two counts, possession of a firearm contrary to a prohibition order, Section 117.01(3), Criminal Code.

An ambulance pulled directly in front of us one morning while I was waiting on Randy to return from Tim Hortons. We were on our way to Saskatoon for my first appointment with a speech therapist, stopping briefly for a quick breakfast. I was wondering if that was the same ambulance I rode in almost a month ago. Remembering details I hadn't thought about, suddenly, with excitement, I

recognized the driver. It was

the pretty blonde paramedic who tended to me. I didn't think I would ever see her again to thank her. Unbuckling my seatbelt with record speed, promptly I was standing beside her. She opened the driver's window, and with a smile of recognition, she exclaimed, "It's YOU! I remember you!"

My wish to thank her came true and I was elated when her partner arrived with their take-out. We exchanged smiles. She was the one behind the wheel in the darkness and uncertainty of that early morning. And thank them both, I did. Exuberantly. We parted exchanging happy words and smiles, the kind driver wishing me a Merry Christmas. As they drove away it felt full circle. When they'd last seen me I couldn't speak or move my right arm but that day, with my new 'broken' accent, I did. I turned and returned their wave - with my RIGHT arm. My next stop that same day was an awaited eager meeting with my speech therapist. I was returning to the big city, but this time my ride wasn't in the back of an ambulance.

As I write this in the quiet of an early dark Thursday morning, our living room is in disarray. As a gift to me, our oldest son has been renovating our home, room by room. There's new paint on the walls and trim, tall cabinets have been added to our mudroom to tidy the clutter that only front entrances can gather. Wainscoting has been added to a wall in the living room and it matches the wainscoting on hallway walls from his previous renovations several years ago. Christmas trim and decorations are absent in our home this year. A fatigue like I have never known overwhelms me limiting what I would like to do. My doctor and speech therapist both tell me to respect

my 'brain injury' as it desperately cries at me to stop, to just REST, so it can heal. That the nerves can rejuvenate and find new pathways so I may function like I did on the previous side of this stroke. I can't be reckless with my health for I was given a second chance, the gift of a Merry Christmas 24/7!!

But sitting atop our kitchen entry table is the welcoming, warm sight of a small faux Christmas tree. A gift from a special friend, it arrived with a small box of decorations. She knew I needed it. It isn't just a tree, it is a hug. Beside it, a mounting stack of Christmas cards with warm personal sentiments hand written inside. More hugs.

My grown children emphatically tell me, "Mu-um, don't buy us or give us anything this year because YOU are our gift." The mother's heart inside me rebels and says, "It's Christmas! I've been wrapping presents for you since you were born and every year striving for a perfect Christmas. How can I not?"

Randy just returned from early errands in town. He is carrying a huge wreath and sporting one of his biggest ever grins. Gobsmacked, wordlessly I stare at him. He explains: "This is for you from my cousin, Norma. She asked me to get you flowers but I thought you would really like this instead!" We both remembered last year. The wreath from our front door blew away during a snowstorm. Later, while clearing the tall white drifts and banks, Randy didn't see it because it had been buried, and the blade and tires of his skid-steer drastically altered its shape. And beauty. I was blinking back tears.

As the sun rises on this new day my heart is full and my stark, as in non-Christmasy, home has everything we need: the beautiful wreath on our front door and a tiny Christmas tree in the kitchen reminds me it's full of love. I am so mindful of knowing that somewhere, someone is going through something really tough and its Christmas. I know I am way beyond lucky, profusely blessed. I have to agree with a very interesting fellow, novelist, Jack Kerouac. He said, "Some people are so poor, all they have is money."

A ride in an ambulance, sirens blaring, and with a heart monitor stuck to my chest changed my sloppy attitude pretty quick. I was given the gift of looking at tomorrow with the eyes of gratitude and faith.

Merry Christmas my friends. If you're going through a hard time, I'm sorry. But I can promise you that the thing you think you can't survive is the thing that makes you better than you used to be. Love Arlene!


