SaskPower earmarks funds for Aspen Power Station Project near Lanigan

With a plan to modernize, grow and sustain Saskatchewan’s electricity system including investing in a new natural gas plant near Lanigan, SaskPower is aiming to spend \$1.15 billion during its 2023-’24 fiscal year. Outlining its capital spending in a May 11 release, the company indicated \$505 million has been set aside for growth projects like new natural gas plants such as the Aspen Power Station near Lanigan and the Great Plains Power Station.


“Decarbonizing a growing power grid is a once-in-a-lifetime challenge, and making the right investments now will help to position SaskPower to provide reliable, sustainable and cost-effective electricity to customers in the years and decades to come,” said Rupen Pandya, SaskPower President and CEO.

In addition to the \$505 million in growth projects, SaskPower noted planned capital expenditures include \$517 million to maintain and upgrade existing transmission, distribution and generation assets. The company is also seeing \$129 million placed in strategic investments, allowing them to continue with smart meter deployment and work on projects like a Logistics Warehouse Complex in Regina. Also part of the planned capital work, rural power line rebuilds and wood pole replacements are being done in communities like Watrous and Wynyard.

“Our government is committed to building a cleaner energy future while also ensuring we have reliable and affordable electricity to power the growing provincial economy,” Minister Responsible for SaskPower Don Morgan said. “This year’s capital budget is a demonstration of SaskPower’s commitment to the people of Saskatchewan, by making significant investments to transition to low-carbon energy sources, upgrading aging infrastructure and modernizing systems.”

As for the Aspen Power Station, according to SaskPower, the facility would provide enough power for about 370,000 homes in Saskatchewan, deliver reliable power and support renewable power generation and transition away from conventional coal. The proposed 370-megawatt combined-cycle natural gas power plant which would be located about 17 kilometres west of Lanigan would include both a gas and steam turbine generator along with a heat recovery generator. The project is expected to have an operational lifespan of 25 years.

While it took a little longer than usual, once the warmer weather arrived and snow disappeared it was not long until a familiar flower began appearing. With the crocus out in full bloom, a sure sign that spring arrived, the temperatures marched towards the high 20°C range before a thick haze of smoke arrived due to the Alberta and Saskatchewan forest fires. That prompted Environment and Climate Change Canada to issue an air quality advisory as the band of thick smoke lingered over much of southern and central Saskatchewan. By the latter part of the week, the smoke drifted southward; however, southwestern and west central areas of the province remained downwind of large fires in northern Saskatchewan. Fire bans were also issued this past week in a number of jurisdictions including north of Hwy. 16.

Winners announced as part of Better Newspapers Competition

Seeding underway in province

Producers have made substantial progress in seeding over the past week. That is according to the Ministry of Agriculture's weekly Crop Report for May 9 to 15. Seeding is currently 38 percent completed in the province, up 29 percent from last week. This is behind the five-year average of 53 percent, but it is close to the 10-year average of 44 percent. Currently, seeding is more advanced in the western half of the province. Rain in the southeast has provided moisture relief while halting seeding operations for a few days.

The northwest is currently furthest along with 55 percent of crop in the ground. The west-central is at 54 percent and the southwest 43 percent. The southeast region has the least amount of acres seeded in the province with 18 percent of crop in so far. Wet fields in the southeast and east central regions have slowed fieldwork.

Field peas are the crop with the most seeding progress, with 54 percent seeded. Lentils (50 percent) and spring wheat (43 percent) are leading the crops in seeding progress. Oats (19 percent), canola (19 percent), flax (10 percent), and soybeans (seven percent) are the crops with the least amount of seeding

progress.

Pockets of rain moved through the province and replenished many dry areas in the southeast. The Bienfait region received the most with up to 78 mm of rain. Other notable rain in the last week includes the Vanguard area receiving 24 mm and the Marengo area receiving 22 mm of rain. Rain was also received in the northern region of the province, with a maximum of 13 mm reported in the North Battleford region.

Provincial topsoil moisture levels have shifted slightly from adequate to short. Topsoil moisture for cropland is reported as 69 percent adequate and 24 percent short. Pasture and hayland topsoil moisture follows a similar pattern with 63 percent being adequate and 28 percent short.

Producers are busy seeding while watching their early seeded crops begin to emerge. Many are busy applying pre-seed herbicide applications and pre-working their fields ahead of seeding. Cattle are being moved out to greening pastures and branding has started.

With the dry conditions, producers are reminded to stay vigilant about fire risk and to have fire prevention equipment at the ready. Stress is high this time of year for producers and producers are reminded to take safety precautions in all

RCMP Report

RCMP identify human remains in RM of Morris

In February 2021, Watrous RCMP received a report of human remains located in the RM of Morris. Saskatchewan RCMP Major Crimes took carriage of the investigation. Since then, Major Crimes has been working to identify the remains, in conjunction with Watrous RCMP, Saskatchewan RCMP's Forensic Identification Services, Police Dog Services, the Saskatchewan Coroners Service and a forensic anthropologist.

In March 2022, investigators enlisted the assistance of a forensic genealogy firm. Using DNA, the experts were able to determine the deceased individual had closely-related relatives in the Red Deer, Alta. area.

Further investigation by Major Crimes determined the remains likely belonged to a woman from Red Deer, who was last seen there in January 2021. She had not been reported missing to police. In January 2023, Saskatchewan RCMP Forensic Identification Services conclusively determined the human remains belong to Cassandra Jorquera, who would have been 27 years old at the time of her death. Her family has been notified.

Major Crimes continues to investigate the circumstances of Cassandra's death, which investigators have determined is suspicious in nature.

Investigators want to speak with anyone who has information about Cassandra's death, or has knowledge of her activities in and around January 2021. Cassandra often frequented Red Deer and is known to have been there in January 2021. She also visited Grande Prairie periodically. Her connection to Saskatchewan is unknown at this time.

Investigators released her photo and description to help advance this investigation. Cassandra was approximately 5'5" and 110 lbs. She had shoulder-length dark brown hair and brown eyes. Her family describes her as having "beautiful" teeth.

"Since February 2021, we've worked diligently to identify the person located deceased. We now know it's Cassandra. Our work continues: we need to retrace all of her steps in January 2021," said Sgt. Ryan Boogaard from Saskatchewan RCMP Major Crimes. "I know it was some time ago, but we're asking people – particularly in the Red Deer area – to take a look at her picture and think back. Did you know Cassandra? Did you speak with her or encounter her in the weeks after New Year's 2021? You may have a piece of the puzzle that will help us determine what happened to her in those final weeks of her life."

RCMP assisting communities affected by wildfires

During the second week of May, a group of officers from Saskatchewan RCMP's Tactical Support Group travelled to Alberta to assist Alberta RCMP as fires threatened communities in the province's northwest region. RCMP officers patrolled in and around evacuated communities to provide police visibility and deter criminal activity. They returned from duties in Alberta late during that week.

Over the May 12th weekend, a wildfire southeast of Dillon led to the full evacuation of the communities of Buffalo River Dene Nation, St. George's Hill and Michel Village, and of vulnerable residents in Buffalo Narrows. Visibility on the roads in the area has been poor due to smoke, and Buffalo Narrows RCMP accompanied buses carrying evacuees until they were out of the affected area. Hwy. 155, between Buffalo Narrows and Ile a la Crosse, was closed May 15 and Ile a la Crosse RCMP were assisting with redirecting traffic. Officers were proactively patrolling evacuated communities to ensure they remain safe and secure. Both Buffalo Narrows and Ile a la Crosse RCMP continue to monitor the fire and are in frequent contact with the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) and community leadership.

Hot, dry conditions continued moving into the long weekend and Saskatchewan RCMP urged everyone to be mindful of current fire bans. Be cautious if you do light a fire for camping or cooking, if you are disposing of cigarettes or if you are driving or parking any type of vehicle off-road.

RCMP respond to assault

At approximately 8:45 a.m., Loon Lake RCMP received a report of an assault near a clinic on Ministikwan Lake Cree Nation. Investigation determined a female, who was armed with a knife, assaulted an adult male, who was treated by EMS at the scene for injuries described as non-life-threatening. The female remained at the scene and was not allowing people to access the clinic. Officers immediately responded and located the female, who was distraught and not cooperating with attempts to bring her into custody without risk to the safety of herself, officers and bystanders. An officer deployed a conducted energy device and she was then safely taken into custody and assessed by medical personnel.

As a result of investigation, the 34-year-old female was charged with: one count, aggravated assault, Section 268, Criminal Code; one count, assault on police officer with weapon, Section 270.01(2), Criminal Code; one count, assault with weapon, Section 267(a), Criminal Code; and one count, possession of a weapon for a dangerous purpose, Section 88(2), Criminal Code. She will make her next court appearance in Loon Lake on July 27, 2023.

RCMP respond to vehicle pedestrian collision

At approximately 11:45 p.m. May 13, Spiritwood RCMP

received a report of a vehicle-pedestrian collision at the intersection of Hwy. 24 and 945. The pedestrian, a 37-year-old male from Pelican Lake First Nation, passed away at the scene. His family has been notified. The driver of the vehicle remained at the scene of the collision. No charges have been laid. Spiritwood RCMP continue to investigate with the assistance of a Saskatchewan RCMP collision reconstructionist.

Punnichy and Southey RCMP warn the public of dangerous illicit drugs circulating in the area

Officers have responded to numerous suspected overdoses in the past few weeks – including two fatal incidents, one in each detachment area. Preliminary investigation suggests fentanyl may have been involved in these incidents, but this cannot be confirmed until the results of a toxicology have been complete by the Saskatchewan Coroners Service. The investigations are still ongoing.

"If you choose to use, we are urging you to be cautious – use small amounts and don't use alone. For anyone in this affected area, we need you to ask yourself – do you know what to do if someone around you overdoses?" said Sgt. Kim Stewart from the Southey RCMP. "Recognizing the signs and knowing what to do could potentially save someone's life. When someone overdoses, their breathing may be slow, weak, or even stop. They may make gurgling or choking sounds and their lips or fingernails may turn blue. They may be dizzy, confused or seem exhausted. If you see these signs, call 911 immediately."

She adds that the Good Samaritan Drug Overdose Act provides some legal protection for individuals who seek emergency help during an overdose, including the person experiencing an overdose.

"We also want residents in the area to consider keeping naloxone on hand," said S/Sgt. Curtis Pelzer from the Punnichy RCMP. "It's a fast-acting drug used to temporarily reverse the effects of overdoses caused by opioids. It's not hard to administer, either. Emergency responders carry it, as do frontline RCMP officers. But did you know you can, too?"

The Government of Saskatchewan offers a 'take home naloxone' kit available free of charge, as well as take-home fentanyl and benzodiazepine drug checking strips. Find out where you can get them here. Naloxone is also available for purchase at many pharmacies in the province.

If you'd like help quitting drugs, or if you have a loved one suffering from drug addiction, visit www.saskatchewan.ca/addictions or call the Province of Saskatchewan's HealthLine at 811 for information on support and services.

Getting dangerous illicit drugs off the street continues to be a top priority for the Saskatchewan RCMP. If you have information about drug trafficking in your area, you can report it to your local detachment by calling 310-RCMP. Information can also be submitted anonymously through Crime Stoppers by calling 1-800-222-TIPS (8477) or submitting a tip online at www.saskcrimestoppers.com.

“Following our technical studies and consultations with stakeholders, rightsholders and Indigenous groups, we’ve submitted the initial project description to the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada. We’ve also started the process of looking for an engineer, procure, construct (EPC) partner to design and build the power station. We expect construction to begin in 2024 and for the power station to be fully constructed in 2027.”

As part of the first stage of Plan, Define and Consult, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada has invited the public to review on the summary of the Initial Project Description and provide feedback related to
