

Work on new school in Lanigan moves to next stage

With a nice fall and minimal delays thus far, crews have made substantial progress on the brand new state-of-the-art Pre-K to Gr. 12 school in Lanigan.

Originally announced in July 2020 as part of the Government of Saskatchewan's \$7.5 billion two-year capital plan to stimulate the province's economic growth and with the current elementary and high schools aging, following a June 19 sod turning, work got underway on the new facility.

After the site was cleared and necessary groundwork done, Horizon School Division CEO Kevin Garinger said close to 350 pilings were done by Quorex, some going as deep as 17 metres. "It has been a real exciting project for the community and for us at Horizon. All the pilings were done before Thanksgiving and the last of the foundation was completed Oct. 12. Now all of the steel will be arriving before the end of October and will be put up extremely quickly. Once that steel goes up, people will literally start seeing the new school."

Courtesy of the nice weather, Garinger said substantial progress was made in the fall and with little to no frost, he estimated the project is only delayed by about a week or so. "We are right on schedule. They had planned for more significant issues because the pilings go so deep in the ground but there were very few issues that way and so we are really at a good place for the next stage of seeing the steel get put up."

Now that Quorex has reached the next stage, Garinger anticipates the steel will be put up quickly and it will be unlikely that crews will require a bunch of heated storage for it. Following the work to erect the steel, once the structure is enclosed, electrical and mechanical work along with concrete pouring would occur. "We are very excited. It is amazing to see at every stage of the build how it is coming

together. Now that we are advancing into the steel stage, there has been a lot of incredible work done but lots more to go. It has been tremendous but done in a way to minimize the impact on our students with all of the noise outside."

With construction on the approximately 400 student \$26 million school occurring next to the current schools, Garinger explained once the majority of the new building is up and close to being ready to go, the decommissioning and demolition of the current facilities would occur nearly

simultaneously to create parking lot space.

"We are still pushing to open the new school sometime in early 2025. We were hoping for September of 2024 but it will probably be closer to February 2025 that we will reach substantial completion which will allow us to begin looking at moving our students into the school. Once that occurs, the current schools will be taken down to create space for a parking lot and a vehicle loop at the front of the new school."

Once the brand new place is done and

officially open for students and staff, it will feature a modern and spacious design, with an estimated area of 4,829 square metres to accommodate students and staff. As part of that, the facility will house state-of-the-art labs for Industrial Arts, Science, Home Economics and the Arts, as well as a large main gymnasium and a smaller secondary gym. Garinger stated the new school will also prioritize accessibility and will strongly emphasize mental wellness, with welcoming counselling spaces available to students and staff.

RCMP Report

RCMP seeking information about death

On Oct. 16, 2023, at approximately 4 p.m., Cut Knife RCMP received a report of an individual who passed away located in a rural area on Poundmaker First Nation.

With the assistance of the Saskatchewan Coroners Service, Major Crimes has identified the individual as 31-year-old Lee Barsears of Little Pine First Nation. His family have been notified. Major Crimes continue to work diligently to determine the circumstances leading to Lee's death, which investigators have determined is suspicious in nature.

Anyone with information about Lee's whereabouts in and around October 2023, or his death, should contact Saskatchewan RCMP Major Crimes at 639-625-4535. Information can also be submitted anonymously by contacting Saskatchewan Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS (8477) or www.saskcrimestoppers.com.

Report of firearms discharged

On Oct. 12, 2023 at approximately 2:20 p.m., Waskesiu/Montreal Lake RCMP received a report of a firearms discharge outside of a residence on Montreal Lake Cree Nation.

Officers immediately responded and located an injured adult male, who was taken to hospital with injuries described as serious in nature. Investigation determined that there was an altercation between the victim and two other males. A firearm was discharged and the male was injured.

Officers immediately began searching for the suspects. One was arrested at a residence on Montreal Lake Cree Nation later on Oct. 12. The other was arrested at a residence north of Montreal Lake on Oct. 13. As a result of investigation, 27-year-old Deon Smith and 29-year-old Justice Bird, both from Montreal Lake Cree Nation are charged with: one count, aggravated assault, Section 268(2), Criminal Code; one count, assault with a weapon, Section 267(1), Criminal Code; and one count, discharge firearm with intent, Section 244, Criminal Code.

Arrests made

On June 7, 2022, Waskesiu/Montreal Lake RCMP received a report of a sudden death on Montreal Lake Cree Nation. Thirty-three-year-old Chad Bird's death was determined to be a homicide and Saskatchewan RCMP Major Crimes has been investigating since.

As a result of investigation, on Oct. 14, 2023, 37-year-old Julian Ganton from Prince Albert was arrested in Saskatoon with the assistance of Saskatchewan RCMP's Warrant Enforcement

and Suppression Team and Saskatoon Police Service.

Ganton is charged with one count, being an accessory after the fact to murder, Section 240, Criminal Code and one count, driving while prohibited, Section 320.18(1), Criminal Code.

On Oct. 16, 2023, 26-year-old Tristen Naytowhow from Prince Albert was arrested in Prince Albert. He is charged with one count, second degree murder, Section 235(1), Criminal Code and one count, possession of a firearm while prohibited, Section 117.01(1), Criminal Code.

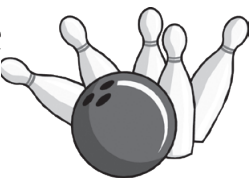

The real-estate line rings out, “location, location, location” as guide to both buyer and seller. success by combining one-quarter cup OxiClean with one gallon hot water and pouring the solution onto the area. Another solution is bleach but most experience that this application removes the floor finish and shine. Kindly inform me as to a safe and environmental friendly homemade cleaner for my stainless steel fridge door. There is a streak of something spilled down the front, which cannot be removed by soap and water, vinegar or lemon. Thank you very much, Barb

Dear Barbara,
For regular stainless steel cleaning a soft cloth dampened with

water is all you need. Wipe the cloth in the direction of the grain. For stubborn stains, wipe the fridge with olive oil. Remove excess oil until it shines.

I would like to take plain pasta to a lunch party in a few weeks. What is the best way to transport the pasta so that it does not stick together before the party? Jeremy
Dear Jeremy,
After cooking the pasta, soak it in cold water. Drain the water and coat with a small amount of oil. Toss the noodles and place them into a casserole dish, sealable bag or slow cooker.
Dear Reena,
What are some easy ways to open a stuck jar lid? Thanks Karrie
Dear Karrie,

Here are a few tried and true methods for loosening a jar lid: using the handle of a butter knife, tap the edge of the lid several times firmly around the outside of the lid or run the lid under hot water, while wearing gloves grab the lid and turn. You can also push the tip of a spoon under the lip of the lid and push the spoon down. When you hear a pop the seal is broken, you are then able to turn the lid. Purchase a Boa Constrictor Strap Wrench from a Home Hardware store; makes the job simple.

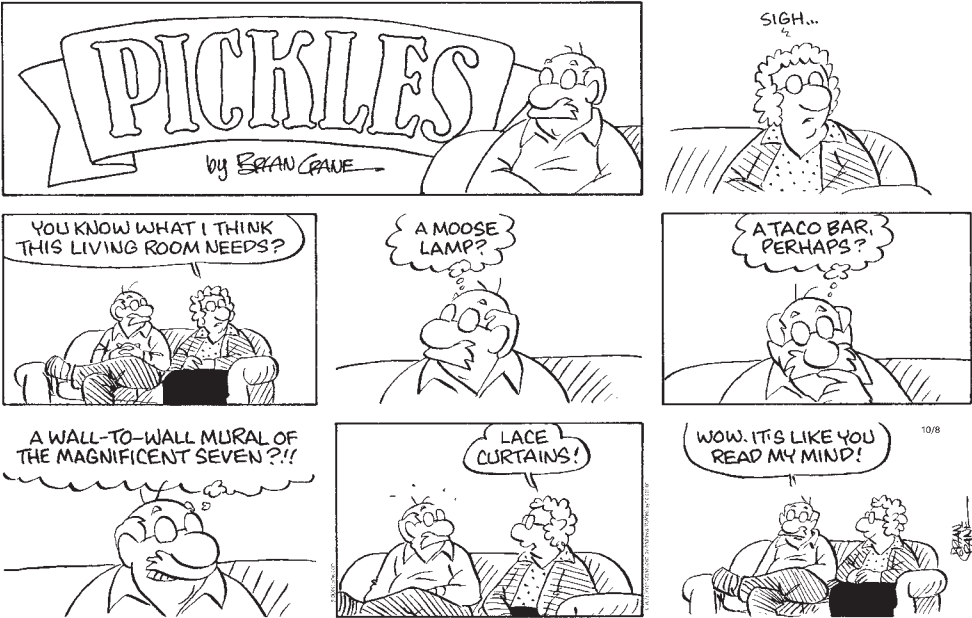
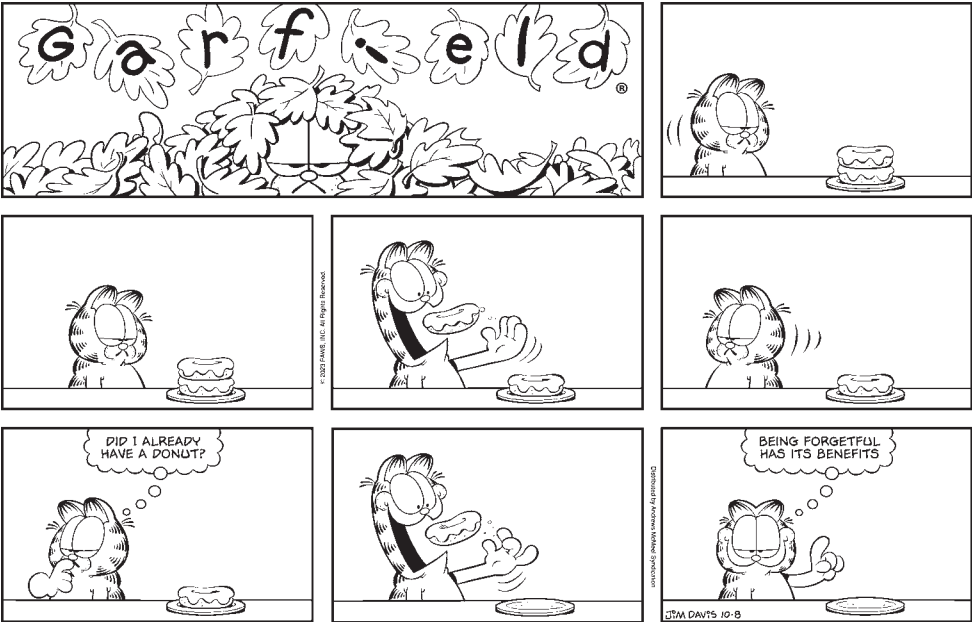

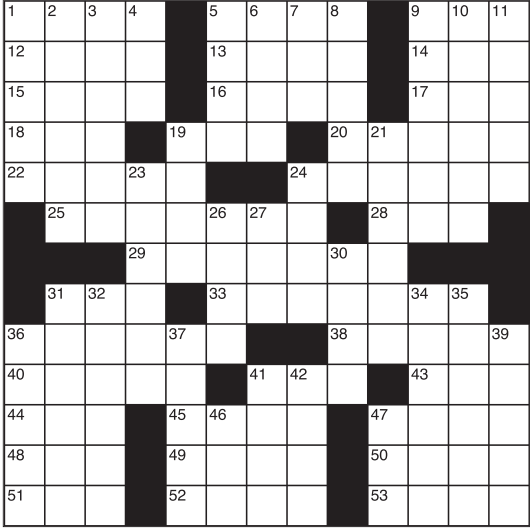
