New doctor in Lanigan enjoying opportunity

After getting a chance to become a bit more familiar with her new role in Lanigan, since her first day on the job, Dr. Eman Nan is looking forward to meeting the town’s residents and those within the surrounding area.

Taking over Aug. 18 from Dr. Mohd Enamul Hoque who joined Dr. Alafia in Lanigan in August 2020 before deciding to return to Leader, Dr. Nan said, “I am excited and enjoying what I am doing. I hope that I can provide the best care I can for the people of Lanigan and the surrounding area.”

Originally from Egypt, Nan grew up in a smaller community similar to the size of Lanigan. Graduating in 2003 before practicing medicine in Egypt, in 2015, Nan along with her husband and twin boys moved to Canada. Bringing along her experience as a family physician and a pediatrician, the doctor lived in Toronto before moving to Saskatchewan.

Wanting to get into medicine for as long as she can remember, Nan likes practicing medicine and has found it very rewarding. The physician also shared perhaps the most exciting part about working as a family physician in a small community is the opportunity to get to know people. “It is a privilege and a pleasure.”

When comparing how Egypt differs from Saskatchewan when it comes to practicing medicine, Nan explained how she likes how comprehensive the approach is to treating an individual as a whole person and the continuity of care that they receive. “Getting to know people over a long span of time, it is very satisfying for me. It is a chance to develop a deep relationship. You are not only the doctor for the people but you are kind of a family. You know a lot about them, not only their health but their life in general and their relationship. It is a

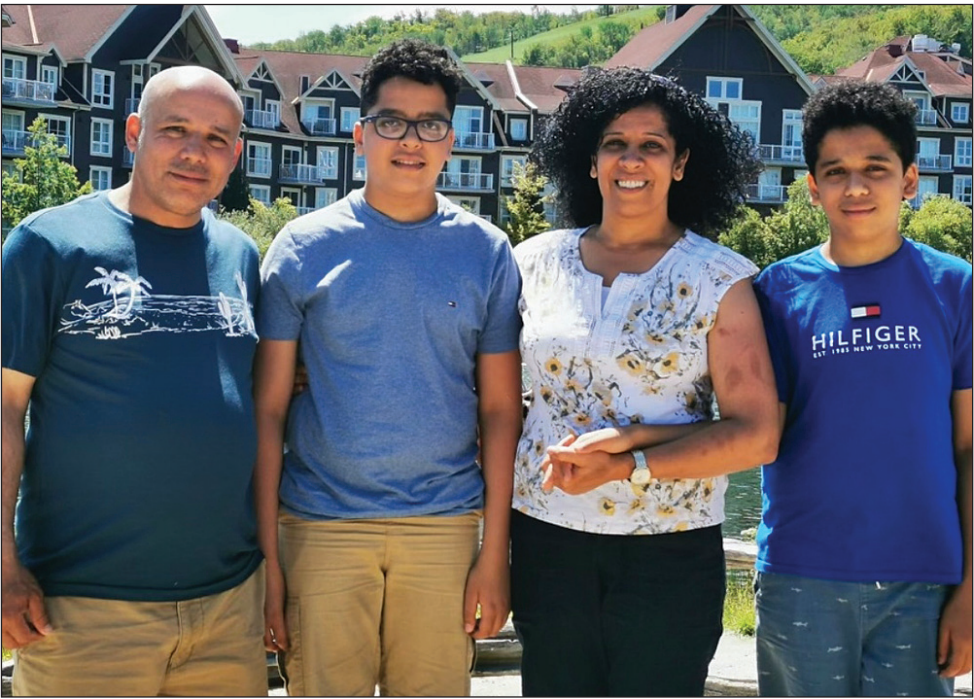
chance to provide the care we are hoping for.”

While things did not work out for Dr. Hoque to remain in the community for a longer period of time, Lanigan Mayor Tony Mycock wished him the best and said having Dr. Nan step in right away made for a more seamless transition. “My hope is that we can build our clinic to try and keep some doctors long term. The turnover in small towns across the province is tough especially because a patient can become comfortable with a physician and then they move on. We were spoiled for a long time years ago and I think everyone got used to that. While it is not quite the same as before, we do have a lot to offer with our clinic. I think a big part of this puzzle to keep our physicians for a long period of time is seeing our hospital’s emergency department reopening.”

With the COVID-19 pandemic hitting Saskatchewan in 2020, as part of Saskatchewan Health Authority’s (SHA) preparedness plan, a number of rural hospitals were deemed as Alternate Level of Care (ALC) sites including Lanigan. That meant emergency services were temporarily put on hold. While the services of the local EMS are still able to be utilized, over a year from when the services at the hospital were temporarily put on hold, SHA stated they remain unchanged from their status this summer and earlier this year.

Like residents of Lanigan and the surrounding area, Dr. Nan said she too is hoping for the hospital to be able to reopen its emergency department. With the significant increase in new COVID-19 cases in recent weeks in the province, Nan said, “That doesn’t look like it is going to happen soon so we will have to wait until things are over with COVID which is the reason it was closed in the first place.”

Actively keeping in touch with SHA, Mycock is hopeful that the health author-

ity is moving in the right direction. “If I was a physician I would want to be utilizing my skills and not having an emergency department, I think it is a detriment to them as well. Having the hospital reopening its emergency department and having the doctors able to do more things would be a plus not only for our residents and the community but for retaining our physicians.”

Mycock said he is doing what he can to try and see the hospital reopen its services but with the pandemic remaining a threat, at the end of the day it is up to SHA.

“It has been a challenge for everyone,” explained Nan about the global pandemic. “Being in the medical field I deeply realize

how sometimes we are far from knowing everything and we have to be learning over time and be open to change and accommodate what is new. On the other hand it puts lots of pressure I feel on many of my patients because they can’t get the medical care they deserve because things are closed and services are delayed. It is kind of frustrating but we are hoping to get rid of COVID.”

Despite the pressures she is faced with during the COVID-19 pandemic, Nan said so far being able to practice her passion in Lanigan has been a very positive experience both with her patients and the people she has been able to work with at the Lanigan and District Medical Clinic.

Official with local roots makes history

From her first days officiating minor hockey league games at the Drake Sportsplex to calling international contests, for Drake native Alex Clarke (nee Blair), the official has not only blazed a trail as a female official but on Sept. 24, made history.

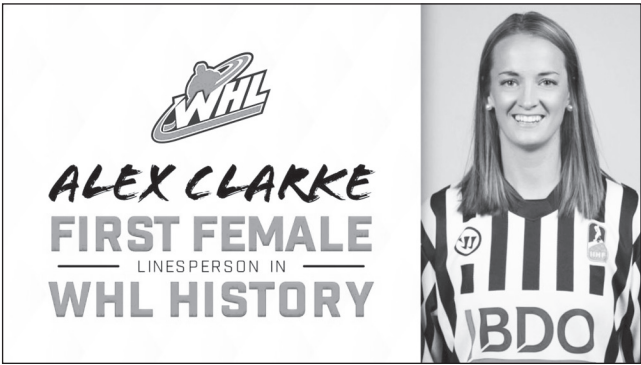
With the puck dropping during a Western Hockey League pre-season contest between the Moose Jaw Warriors and Regina Pats, Clarke became the first woman in Canadian Hockey League history to officiate in a WHL game. In addition, the league also announced on that Friday that Clarke had been added to the WHL officiating team for the upcoming year.

Recently part of the 2021 IIHF Women's World Championship in Calgary, Alta. and now a member of the WHL officiating team for the 2021-'22 season, in a release by the WHL, Clarke said, "I am extremely excited for the opportunity to join the WHL as a linesperson. I have been working towards this for several years now and I believe my development has reached the level required to perform in the WHL. I'm looking forward to the challenges and growth the WHL will bring to my officiating journey, and I'm excited about the potential for other female officials to enjoy similar opportunities in high-level male hockey."

To those who know her, it should come as no surprise that Clarke has been given the opportunity to excel in the WHL after all of her prior experience. Now residing in Weyburn, the official has been a part of a number of high level international events including being assigned to the 2020 IIHF Women's World Championship, the 2019 IIHF Women's World Championship (Division 1, Group B), the 2018 4 Nations Cup, and the 2018 IIHF U18 Women's World Championship (Division II, Group B). In addition, the 28-year-old has skated in nearly 300 games in Saskatchewan since the 2017-'18 season, including: in the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League; the Saskatchewan Female U18 AAA League; U SPORTS Women's Hockey; the Saskatchewan Male U18 AAA League; and the Prairie Junior Hockey League.

"For the past several years we have been monitoring Alex's development and progression as an official," said Kevin Muench, WHL Senior Director, Officiating. "She has been highly successful in Junior A and her recent performance at the IIHF Women's World Championship was highlighted by her assignment to the bronze medal game. She has proven she is ready to take the next step in her career by earning the opportunity to be on the ice in the WHL."

As Alex geared up for the pre-season game and took to

the ice in Moose Jaw, a number of WHL teams expressed their congratulations through social media along with WHL Commissioner Ron Robison who said, "On behalf of the WHL and all our member Clubs, we wish to extend a warm welcome to Alex Clarke as she joins our WHL Officiating program. Alex has proven herself to be a world-class linesperson and we look forward to her continuing her development as an official in the WHL."

While Clarke played hockey and officiated in Drake, after graduating from high school, she headed south to compete at College of St. Scholastica in Duluth, Minn. for four years where she captained her team during her final season in 2014-'15.

Following her college career, she was drafted by the Calgary Inferno of the Canadian Women's Hockey League (CWL) but had to retire due to a knee injury. Since retiring in 2015, Clarke has been officiating as a member of Hockey Saskatchewan.

Keeping an eye on her officiating career over the years, when the announcement was made that Clarke would be

involved in a WHL pre-season game, the Hockey Sask Officiating Program tweeted: "Congrats to Alex Clarke who is set to make Officiating History as the 1st Female to work in the @TheWHL. It is very exciting to see all Alex's hard work and dedication pay off to get to this level."

Hockey Sask also congratulated Clarke by tweeting out: "Congratulations to #HockeySask official Alex Clarke on becoming the First Female Linesperson in @TheWHL history!"

Following the pre-season and Clarke's historic night of officiating, the WHL regular season was scheduled to begin Oct. 1 with seven games.

Lemon Rainbow Dessert

Ingredients:

- 1 small white cake, baked
- 1 lemon pie filling mix
- 2 to 4 tbsp. lemon juice
- 1 small bag coloured marshmallows
- 1 cup boiling water
- Cool Whip or whipped cream

Directions:

In a glass 9 x 13 pan, crumble the cake into small pieces. Sprinkle the marshmallows over this. Mix the lemon pie filling according to directions on the package. Add the boiling water and the lemon juice. Pour carefully over the cake and marshmallows in the pan, using a fork to make sure the sauce gets all around the pieces. Cool to room temperature, then place in the fridge. Before serving, ice with Cool Whip or whipped cream. Best made the day before serving.
