Lanigan Community Gift & Thrift’s gala a tremendous success

It was an evening to remember as the Lanigan Community Gift & Thrift not only celebrated a milestone but raised funds in an effort to support Mennonite Central Committee’s (MCC) work around the globe. Turning 40 in November and a fixture within Lanigan and the surrounding areas for decades, the local Community Gift & Thrift held a gala fundraiser Nov. 18.

Aimed at raising money for MCC’s material aid program which is utilized in many countries around the world, Lanigan Community Gift & Thrift shop manager Heidi Martens Weber said after expenses from the gala they were able to send approximately \$5,500 to MCC. “We had great attendance at the event with over 165 tickets sold. The event also included cheesecake desserts, a silent auction, raffle items and a craft sale.”

MCC Saskatchewan Donor Engagement Coordinator Karla Koehn said, “We are so grateful for Heidi and the Community Gift & Thrift for not only choosing to support MCC in this way but also to support the material resource program. The Community Gift & Thrift also supports material resources by providing a space in their shop for the blanket making group to meet once a week to make warm, cozy blankets for MCC that also get sent overseas to partner organizations that have requested them. We are so thankful that Heidi and her team have been able to adapt their floor space to make room for the blanket making group. And of course we are thankful to all those who donate their time and resources to make the blankets as well.”

With around \$5,500 being sent to MCC, Koehn shared about the importance of that funding and what it will mean on a global scale. “The funds will go towards our

material resources program at MCC SK, which provides material aid including relief kits, hygiene kits, school kits, sewing kits, dignity kits and comforters to people affected by war and disaster around the world. Our focus right now at MCC SK is to pack 1,000 relief kits and 2,000 hygiene kits, which include basic hygiene items for families (relief kits) and individuals (hygiene kits). These funds will help us cover the cost of the items we have purchased to get packed in these kits. The kits are likely to go to Ukraine in later December or may also go to places like Jordan, Syria and

South Sudan, just to name a few.”

In addition to raising funds as part of MCC’s material resources program, a fashion show was also held at the Lanigan Town Hall during the evening gala. With the stage decorated for the Christmas season, volunteers of all ages dressed up and walked the runway displaying clothing from different eras. With smiles on their faces and from those in attendance, Heidi said it was a terrific event. “We were happy that many people made it out and we had a great evening.”

Charges laid after vehicle stuck in ditch

On Nov. 29, 2022 after responding to an initial report of an assault at a residence, officers located the male suspect in a vehicle stuck in a ditch approximately 15 kilometres west of Pierceland. The male suspect was arrested. During a subsequent search of the vehicle, officers located and seized approximately 900 grams of suspected crystal methamphetamine and drug trafficking paraphernalia.

As a result of this investigation, Justin Skulte, 33, of Cold Lake, Alta., was charged with one count, possession for the purpose of trafficking a controlled substance, Section 5(2),

Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. He is currently remanded and appeared in court in Meadow Lake on Dec. 1. Through further investigation, 30-year-old Tessa Urlacher has also been charged with one count, possession for the purpose of trafficking a controlled substance, Section 5(2), Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. The investigation is ongoing.

Train derailment

From Dec. 1 to 3, Estevan RCMP assisted with maintaining traffic safety along Hwy. 39, approximately two kilometres west of Macoun following a train derailment.

Estevan RCMP also assisted with evacuating residents in the community and patrolling the perimeter of the evacuation zone to ensure no one crossed into it. Officers received no reports of injuries to residents in the area or members of the CP Rail crew.

The highway was closed for over 40 hours and opened around 4 a.m. on Saturday, Dec. 3. Estevan RCMP will not be providing further updates on this incident.

After writing and illustrating ‘Flowman and the Magic Mullet’, the pair of Watrous area residents were thrilled to be able to release ‘Runaway Cow’ just in time for Christmas. Graciously taking time out of their busy schedules, Emily and Konn shared about the book, Runaway Cow and how it came to be. **How exciting is it to have this book released?**

We are very happy to have this new book released. Our goal was to have it ready in time for Christmas so we are happy we were able to complete the project just in time. **Can you share a bit about what it is about?** The story of Runaway Cow is told from the cow’s perspective. Cow 1422B, or ‘the Great Moodini’ as her friends like to call her, was quite the escape artist. She found herself in trouble for fence crawling and pushing boundaries on more than one occasion. But then one day, what seemed like an ordinary day on the farm soon turned into one extraordinary story. After realizing that her owners were taking her to the vet at the local animal hospital, the Great Moodini hatched a plan to escape and that’s

when the real adventure begins. **What was the inspiration behind the book and how much fun was this project?** This book was particularly fun for us because it is based on the true story of a cow that ran wild through Watrous after escaping from the local animal hospital quite a few years back. Eggnog Almond Cake

Ingredients:
6 tbsp. butter, divided
2/3 cup sliced almonds
1 box yellow cake mix
1 1/2 cups eggnog
2 eggs
1 tsp. rum extract
1/8 tsp. nutmeg

Directions:
Grease a 10 inch fluted tube pan with two tablespoons of the butter. Press al-

monds onto the bottom and up the sides of the pan. Melt remaining butter. Beat cake mix, eggnog, eggs, rum extract and melted butter on low for 30 seconds, then beat on medium for about two minutes until the batter is smooth. Pour into prepared pan. Bake at 350°F for about 40 to 50 minutes or until a toothpick inserted comes out clean. Cool for about 15 minutes before removing from pan to a wire rack to finish cooling. Great recipe for leftover eggnog.

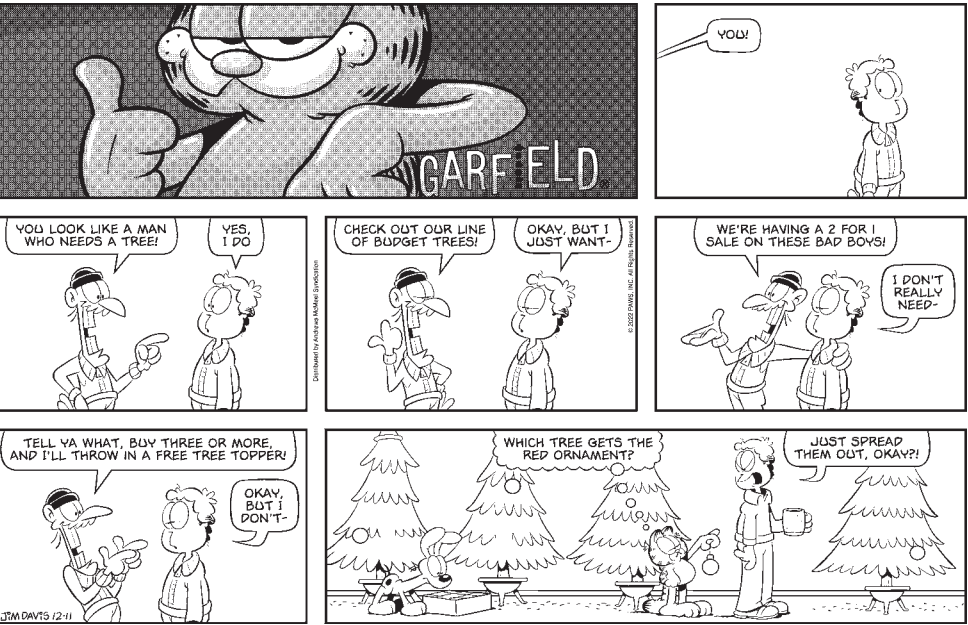
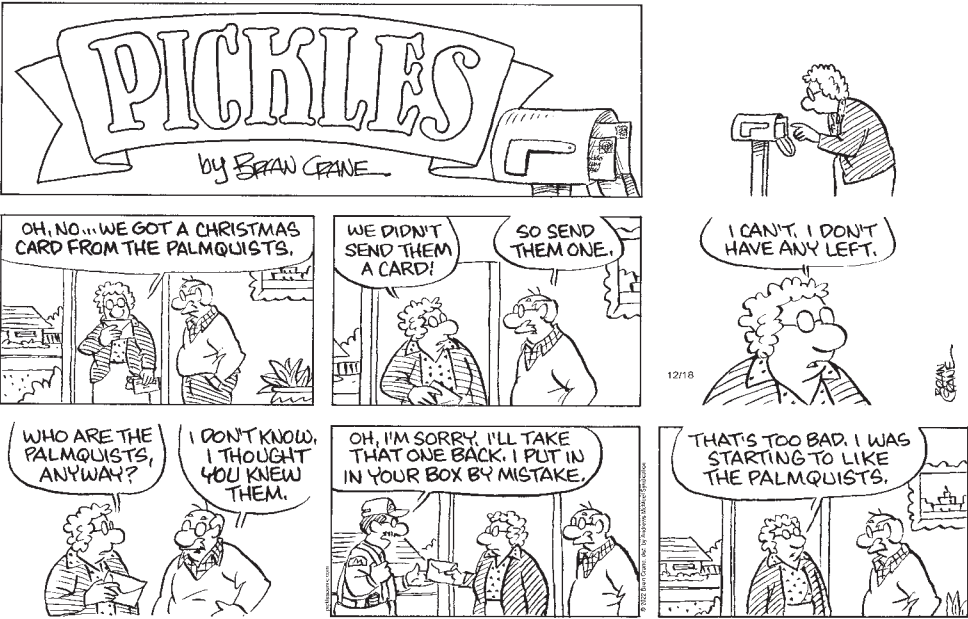

Local MP fights for answers for Canadian Veterans

Moose Jaw-Lake Centre-Lanigan MP Fraser Tolmie has been fighting for answers and results for the countless Veterans in Canada suffering under poor service standards at the department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

Committee testimony from Canadian Veteran Mark Meincke in late October served as a catalyst

for the Veterans Affairs Committee to look deeper into how VA employees have inappropriately suggested Medical Assistance in Dying (MAID) as a solution to mental illness.

"My Conservative colleagues and I have been working hard to get to the bottom of why VA employees are suggesting MAID to Veterans as a treatment for mental illness. Exploring

any use of MAID must only be a conversation between a patient and their doctor, and we are demanding answers for why this happened in the first place."

Questioning Veterans Affairs Minister Lawrence MacAulay during a committee hearing, MP Tolmie had this to say about new information suggesting multiple instances of VA Department employees offering MAID to Veterans suffering from mental illness.

"The ombud report, the Auditor General report, PBO and our own committee said that we're failing in delivering service. Now we're actually analyzing how this service is being delivered and what we're actually doing is offering MAID. Is it in Veterans Affairs' mandate to help members win court cases in MAID instead of helping vets deal with PTSD and become integrated into Canadian society?"

While Meincke's testimony has been the focus of great scrutiny in Veterans Affairs Committee and international media alike, new evidence suggests it was not an isolated incident.

"[Minister MacAulay] first stated that it was one employee and one incident, and then it changed from one employee to two incidents. Now we're at one employee and five incidents."

MP Tolmie and the Conservative Party will continue to demand answers, transparency, and action from the department of Veterans Affairs, and fight for higher service standards for Veterans across Canada.

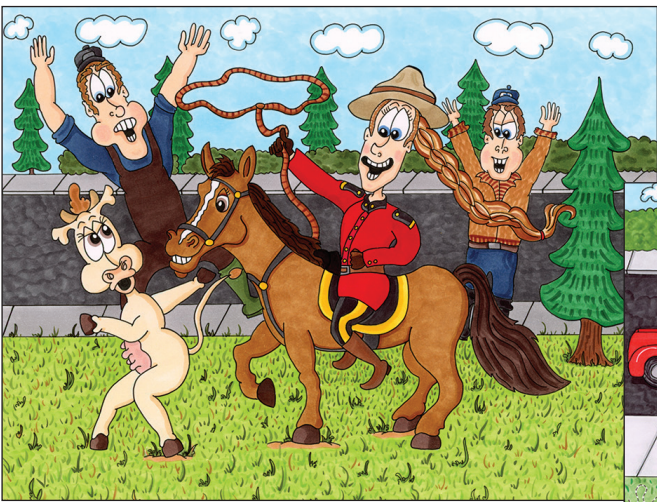
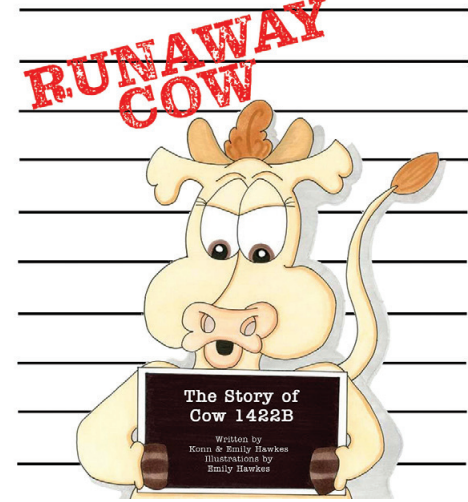

How long did the book take to do?

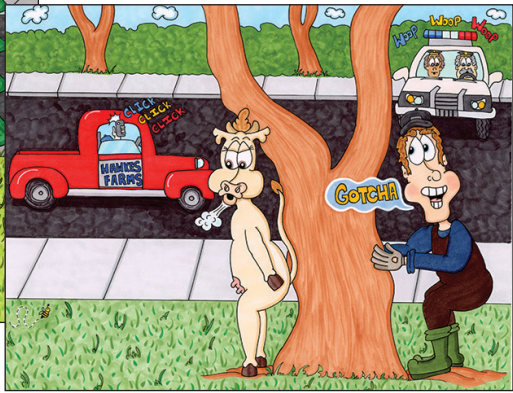
