## Warm weather sticks around as fall arrives

As the seasons officially changed Sept. 22, the temperatures dramatically did not like they have in previous years. With tremendous harvest progress being made, people enjoying outdoor sports and others wanting to soak up as much sun as they can, Environment and Climate Change Canada's David Phillips thinks September missed the email from nature to cool off.


"September is often a fall month not a summer month and we have seen these really cooking temperatures out west. June and July were really close to normal but August was two degrees warmer than normal and for the first 20 days of September, it was almost four and a half degrees warmer than normal."

Going through data as far back as the early 1950s, Phillips said for the local area, there has never been a warmer combined August and September. "I am thinking of all the concern people had for the very slow beginning to the growing season because it was cool and a bit wet in some areas."


Hoping for a nice conclusion to the growing season, many farmers have gotten just that as the sunshine and heat have stuck around and combines remained in the fields. "They ended up with a decent lengthy growing season and this has been really good for producers harvesting."

According to the Ministry of Agriculture's weekly Crop Report for Sept. 6 to 12, many producers in the southwest and west-central regions completed harvest and were on to other field work. From that time period, overall in Saskatchewan a total of 64 percent of the crop was harvested, up from 42 percent the week prior and just ahead of the five-year average of 57 percent. An additional 20 percent of the crop was ready to swath or straight-cut.

With temperatures in August and September combining to be the warmest overall for those two months dating back to the early 1950s, the local area has been a hub of activity in fields as producers get crops off and into bins. # RCMP Report

## Vehicle thefts

Saskatchewan RCMP is reminding farmers to protect vehicles from theft. In the past month, Saskatchewan RCMP has received a number of reports of thefts of trucks parked in fields, including from the Carnduff, Humboldt, Prince Albert, Melville and Weyburn detachment areas.

Saskatchewan RCMP offers farmers the following tips to help deter vehicle thefts: avoid idling an unoccupied vehicle; install an anti-theft system if your vehicle does not have one, or use a steering wheel lock to deter thieves; lock parked vehicles and remove the keys; and while it might be handy to leave a set in

or hidden near a vehicle just in case it must be moved, it's also handy for thieves. Last year in Saskatchewan, at least 29 percent of all stolen vehicles had keys inside.

While it's not always possible during farming operations, try to park vehicles in well-lit, secure areas, or garages, as often as possible.

## Two vehicle collision

At approximately 3:07 p.m. on Sept. 12, Esterhazy RCMP received a report of a two-vehicle collision on Hwy. 16 near Bredenbury. A passenger from one of the vehicles was declared passed away by EMS personnel at the scene of the collision.

The passenger was identified as a 94-year-old female from Yorkton and her family has been notified. Both drivers were transported to the hospital with injuries described as minor in nature. Esterhazy RCMP continue to investigate with the assistance of a Saskatchewan RCMP Collision Reconstructionist.

## Assault at school in North Battleford

Charges are laid against a 16-year-old male after a report of an assault at North Battleford Comprehensive High School on Sept. 14, 2022. The youth cannot be named as per the Youth Criminal Justice Act. He is charged with: one count, aggravated assault, section 268 of the Criminal Code; one count, Possession of

a weapon for a dangerous purpose, section 88 of the Criminal Code, one count, carry a concealed weapon, section 90 of the Criminal Code. He will appear in provincial court next on Oct. 13, 2022 at 1:30 p.m. in North Battleford.

## Aircraft crash

Shaunavon RCMP assisted emergency service responders in a single small aircraft crash near Shaunavon, Sask., which left two deceased. A Saskatchewan RCMP Reconstructionist attended the scene to assist with the investigation and officers from the Shaunavon RCMP assisted with securing the scene for further investigation.

# Sask. expands eligibility for loan forgiveness to veterinarians and vet technologists

The Government of Saskatchewan is expanding eligibility for the Saskatchewan Loan Forgiveness for Veterinarians and Veterinary Technologists program. Any Saskatchewan veterinary practice that offers veterinary services to livestock stakeholders from rural or remote communities is now eligible, which includes, but is not limited to, ambulatory service delivery. This expansion is in addition to designated communities previously announced in 2021, and the service threshold continues to be a minimum of 400 hours of services over a twelve-

month period.

Saskatchewan's growing economy is fueling high demand for veterinary professionals working in rural and remote communities. This program is intended to attract veterinary professionals to work in rural areas by forgiving a portion of their Saskatchewan Student Loan debt for up to five years to a maximum of \$20,000.

"We recognize that the veterinarian shortages in rural Saskatchewan will take ongoing collaboration to resolve," Agriculture Minister David Marit said. "The Government of Saskatchewan takes this issue seriously and is committed to continuing to find additional solutions."

"This expansion will ensure that veterinary professionals providing services to smaller communities are eligible for the program," Advanced Education Minister Gordon S. Wyant, Q.C. said. "It is a positive step forward in addressing the need for veterinarians and veterinary technologists in rural and underserved communities in Saskatchewan."

"The SCA is very pleased with the government's announcement regarding changes to the Loan Forgiveness Program for vets and vet techs," said Saskatchewan Cattlemen's Association Chair Arnold Balicki. "Our industry, like many others, is facing

a shortage of vets which can negatively impact our industry, our ability to expand, our need for an established vet/client relationship for access to drugs and even animal welfare. We had raised concerns with the government previously around the qualifying parameters for this program. We truly appreciate that they took our concerns to heart and made the necessary changes to allow clinics in larger centres such as Prince Albert, who also serve rural clients, to now qualify."

The Loan Forgiveness for Veterinarians and Veterinary Technologists program was announced in 2021 and began accepting applications Jan. 1, 2022.

# Animal health order issued in Sask.

The Ministry of Agriculture's Chief Veterinary Officer has issued an Animal Health Order on Sept. 21, 2022, limiting the transport and comingling of poultry after several cases of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza were confirmed in Saskatchewan.

The health order will be in place until Oct. 21, 2022, at which time it will be reviewed. The order prohibits the movement to and participation of birds in shows, auctions, and agricultural fairs, as well as any other events where birds would be brought together from multiple locations.

The goal of this Animal Health Order is to limit the spread of this virus to new flocks. Producers are reminded to remain vigilant and contact the proper authorities should they have any concerns regarding the health of their flocks. Saskatchewan will continue to work with the CFIA, and the poultry industry to support a coordinated and effective response.

Avian influenza (AI) is a federally reportable disease under the Health of Animals Act. This virus, commonly known as "bird flu," affects food-producing birds including chickens, turkeys, geese, ducks, and quails, as well as pet and wild birds. The Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) is leading the disease response

in Saskatchewan and other provinces experiencing outbreaks in poultry.

Proactive measures, including preventing contact between poultry and wild birds, limiting visitors to barns, using barn-specific clothing and footwear, and regularly monitoring birds for signs of illness, are key to preventing avian influenza on poultry farms. Producers are also reminded that anyone keeping livestock or poultry in Saskatchewan are required to register for a Premises Identification (PID) number. The ability to implement rapid and efficient disease response actions is greatly increased when producers have a PID number.

All detections of highly pathogenic avian influenza in Canada are reported on the CFIA website. Further information on the animal health order and avian influenza in poultry is also available on the ministry of agriculture website.

Although rare, AI can infect humans. Affected people tend to be those who have close contact with infected birds. While birds suspected of having AI should not be used for food to avoid potentially spreading the virus, there are no concerns with eating meat that has been properly cooked.

# Sask. economy leads nation

Saskatchewan is once again a national leader in several key indicators of economic growth, with recent reports by Statistics Canada showing Saskatchewan led in investment in building construction, manufacturing sales and wholesale trade in July 2022.

"Saskatchewan's economy has been leading the country for many months and these numbers show that that momentum is only continuing," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Combined with significant private sector investment, it is clear Saskatchewan has the food, fuel and fertilizer the world wants and needs and that is translating into good jobs and incredible opportunity for the people of our province."

Investment in building construction increased dramatically in July 2022, rising 81.8 percent compared to July 2021. This was by far the highest increase among the provinces and well above the national average of 14.7 percent. The value of investment in building construction totalled \$474 million in July 2022.


Wholesale trade jumped 72 percent in July 2022 compared to July 2021, also the highest increase among provinces and well above the national average of 12.9 percent. Between June 2022 and July 2022, the value of wholesale trade in Saskatchewan increased by 5.6 percent, ranking second in terms of percentage change among the provinces and well above the national average of a 0.6 percent decrease. The value of wholesale trade totalled \$4.2 billion in July 2022.

Manufacturing sales grew 26.8 percent in July 2022 compared to July 2021, the second highest increase among the provinces and above the national average of 19.1 percent. Saskatchewan also placed second among the provinces in month-over-month manufacturing sales growth, with an increase of 4.5 percent, which was above the national average of a 0.9 percent decrease. The value of manufacturing sales totalled \$2.3 billion in July 2022.

Urban housing starts in Saskatchewan increased by 35.6 percent in August 2022 compared to August 2021, the second highest increase among the provinces and well above the national average of 2.8 percent.

In August 2022, Saskatchewan set a record high number of jobs for the month at 581,500 jobs, an increase of 12,300 jobs compared to August 2021.

Saskatchewan's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 4.9 percent, the third lowest among provinces, a decrease from 7.0 percent in August 2021 and below the national average of 5.4 percent.

Fast forward a week later and for Sept. 13 to 21, harvest progress increased to 73 percent, ahead of the five-year average of 68 percent for that time of year. An additional 18 percent of the crop was ready to be swathed or straight-cut.

Harvest was most advanced in the southwest region, where 96 percent of the crop was in the bin. The west-central had 89 percent combined, the southeast 65 percent, the northwest 63 percent, the east-central and northeast were at 52 percent.

As for what had been combined, 97 percent of lentils and field peas, 94 percent of durum, 78 percent of barley, 77 percent of spring wheat, 52 percent of canola and 35 percent of flax has been taken off fields. There is an additional 36 percent of canola that is ready to swath or straight-cut.

In some areas, precipitation was generally welcomed after several weeks of dry weather. Concerns about field and equipment fires eased and there is hope that the rain will be enough in some areas to allow pastures a little regrowth. The Pelly area received 44 mm, the Melfort and Moosomin areas 30 mm, the Lipton area 13 mm, the Rosetown area nine mm and the Vanguard area four mm.

Cropland topsoil moisture is rated as one percent surplus, 37 percent adequate, 40 percent short and 21 percent very short. Hay and pasture land topsoil moisture is rated as one percent surplus, 28 percent adequate, 42 percent short and 29 percent very short.

While there has been some frost advisories issued for parts of Saskatchewan and rain stalling a bit of harvest progress during September, Phillips said the nice weather should continue into October where models indicate warmer and drier conditions. "We feel that because there is a lot of heat left in the land and the lakes that any kind of cool air mass will be tempered somewhat.

"There is not one area in Canada when I look at October that is cooler than normal. Everywhere from Vancouver Island to Buena Vista is showing warmer than normal."

While frost could still arrive despite the nicer daytime temperatures, with a normal high of 17°C for this time of year, if cooler weather does roll through, Phillips indicated it will not dig in and be long lasting or extreme. "Because of the warmer ocean waters all around us, we will continue to have

summery-like weather."

Losing about three minutes of daylight per day as the angle of the sun has gone from around 65° above the horizon June 21 to around 45° or 40°, Phillips shared how that can have an affect on temperatures. "When you look at the months, the middle of July to the middle of August it drops by about one degree. The difference by mid-August to mid-September, it is six degrees, so you feel it. Then when you look from September to October it is almost eight degrees."

Despite the expected drop, this August and September have decided to hang on to the warmer weather for as long as

possible. Phillips senses that will continue into October and extending into November and December, models indicate values to be near normal.

"It is a combination of maybe a little milder at the beginning and cooler at the end. My sense is that we are seeing winter likely to be tame at the beginning and a little tougher at the end. We are not going to cancel winter, that has never happened, but if there was a spot where it would be more winter-like or polar vortex kind of things it is more likely to be in maybe late-January, early-February and then ease out."
