Drake Park Project unveils accessible playground

With an opportunity to create a space for residents and visitors alike to enjoy while revitalizing the area, a new accessible playground will be installed later this month in the Village of Drake.

Securing land close to the school, the Drake Park Revitalizing Project committee received a grant for the equipment while raising funds through community suppers, Winterfest and other events. Because of that, they were then able to get the green light on the \$250,000 project.

"This project is super exciting for the whole community," shared Drake Park Revitalizing Project spokesperson Erin Richard.

"The playground will be fully accessible promoting inclusion and play for all."

With land near the Drake School, once installed just north of the facility, the equipment will be utilized by all of the students. "Drake prides itself on being a community that is inclusive and supportive for the success

for all. We saw a need as the local school was fundraising for new playground equipment and we wanted to ensure that this project could support their needs and also the needs of the community of an outdoor play structure for families to gather."

Planning to have it built June 29, Richard said they are still looking for volunteers to help with the installation, coordination of lunch and snack breaks and childcare during that day. "If you are able to help out, contact us through the sign up form on our Facebook page (Drake Park Project) or send us a message through Facebook."

Started by a group of volunteers within Drake and the surrounding area, the Drake Park Revitalizing Project received a Western Revitalization Grant during the summer of 2022. Helping with some of the costs associated with the project, that really kick started the process and since that time, the dream has become a reality. "Local citizens and organizations have supported fundraising

and events to promote this vision of establishing a gathering place for all peoples in the community of Drake and surrounding communities. The Drake Park Revitalization Project, a non-profit organization, strives to build an interactive outdoor space in which all people in the community, individually, and collectively celebrate, value and support participation and access to community experiences. The local North Star Church also supported the project with a service project last summer, building picnic tables for the space. We love how the community has embraced and supported this project."

Hoping to add more to the remaining space adjacent to the Drake Sportsplex where the baseball diamonds are situated, once the equipment is put in place, Richard said together with the community, further priorities will be determined. "In the fall we will be part of a village-wide meeting to get direction from the community about the next priority in the community. 

VILLAGE OF JANSEN - OFFICIAL COMMUNITY PLAN

NOTICE

Public notice is hereby given that the Council of the Village of Jansen intends to consider the adoption of a bylaw under *The Planning and Development Act, 2007* to adopt a new/updated Official Community Plan.

INTENT

The proposed bylaw establishes municipal land use policies including, but not limited to, the following subjects:

Residential: Existing and future residential development areas, housing diversity, infill development, home-based businesses, and neighbourhood design.

Commercial: Downtown strength, visually appealing commercial districts, supply of commercial land, and provision for attractive highway commercial corridors.

Industrial: Identification of appropriate land for industrial development, visually appealing industrial areas, mitigation of land use conflicts, and industrial servicing capacity.

Transportation & Infrastructure: The integration of planning, finance and engineering to manage infrastructure effectively, ensuring connectivity and traffic safety for all users, encouraging non-motorized transportation, addressing rail safety and mitigation of land use conflicts related to rail, ensuring that future development contributes appropriately to the cost of infrastructure services.

Economic & Tourism Development: The promotion and development of economic and tourism related opportunities for Jansen and region.

Community Services & Recreation: The development and enhancement of recreation and community services within the community, coordination and cooperation in the development of facilities and services, and support for public

service delivery agencies.

Amenities & Dedicated Lands: The enhancement of green space, provision for municipal reserves, and facilitation of connectivity and walkability throughout the Village.

Biophysical Constraints & Hazards: Regulation for development on and near hazard lands, including environmentally sensitive lands, contaminated lands, flood hazard areas. Ensuring source water protection and public safety.

Intermunicipal & Interjurisdictional Cooperation: Pursuing opportunities with government to enhance services and provide innovative opportunities for the Jansen region, agreements under the Treaty Land Entitlement Framework Agreement, and facilitation of interjurisdictional cooperation with neighbouring municipalities, First Nations, and other stakeholders on joint planning issues.

Agricultural Land & Fringe Areas: Ensuring that future urban land requirements are not restricted and working with the RM of Prairie Rose No. 309 to address concerns of mutual interest.

Natural & Heritage Resources: Protection and sustainment of valuable cultural and heritage resources within the Village and region.

Implementation: Policies regarding implementation of the Official Community Plan and the implementation tools that will or may be used for same, including the Zoning Bylaw, subdivision application review, dedication of lands, the use of a Building Bylaw, and the use of Development Levies and Servicing Fees.

The Official Community Plan also contains a Future Land Use Concept map (pictured right) which graphically displays, in a conceptual manner, the present and intended future location and extent of general land uses in and surrounding the Village. This map will assist in the application of general goals, objectives and policies of the Of-

ficial Community Plan. The policies in the Official Community Plan will be implemented primarily through administration of the Village's new Zoning Bylaw.

All land within the Village of Jansen as shown on the Future Land Use Concept contained in this notice is affected by the new Official Community Plan.

REASON

The new Official Community Plan will help direct

and manage growth and development in the Village of Jansen for the next 15 to 20 years.

PUBLIC INSPECTION

Any person may inspect the proposed bylaw at the Village Office, 123 Main Street, Jansen, SK between 8:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M., Monday to Fridays, excluding statutory holidays. Copies are available to persons at cost.

PUBLIC HEARING




Familiar with the process, pleasure and pain of local publishing, I was curious how local weekly newspaper readership has changed since I dabbled in the industry many years ago. Canadian newspapers have faced a multitude of challenges with the prevalence of social media being a primary factor. I did a bit of homework and sadly, noted a decline in readership and advertising revenues because more of us, particularly

the younger generations, turn to social media platforms for news consumption. The world we knew is changing and the convenience and instant accessibility offered by social media shifts the way us Canuckies consume information. I truly believe there are many folks who still rely on and appreciate their local newspaper. According to News Media Canada “four out of five people in Canada (83%) read newspaper content each week and trust the content they read, in print and digital formats.”

Though it pertains to Americans, I am sure the following also speaks for Canadians; The Pew Research Center claims: “Digital news has become an important part of Americans’ news media diets, with social media playing a crucial role in

news consumption. Today, half of U.S. adults get news at least sometimes from social media. When it comes to where Americans regularly get news on social media, Facebook outpaces all other social media sites.”

Exact statistics vary depending on the time frame and geographical scope -- but the closures continue with a profound impact on communities, particularly in terms of the personal touch. Editorials, crafted with an understanding of local issues and values, establish a unique connection with their readers. I believe the loss diminishes the diversity of opinions and perspectives available to residents and readers, undermining the vibrant tapestry of community dialogue.

Marshall McLuhan, a Canadian philosopher whose work is among the cornerstones of the study of media theory, had much to say about the newspaper industry. One of his quotes I’ve always found amusing: “People don’t actually read newspapers. They step into them every morning like a hot bath.”

I think it’s time to show and throw applause at our very own editor. His newspapers have recently won provincial awards and accolades. Once upon a time I also wore the editor cap and know and appreciate the delicate demanding balance between work and family. It certainly is never said enough – so on behalf of everyone (readers, advertisers and subscribers) this is me saying editor DANIEL BUSHMAN – you are appreciated.


Daniel’s local sports and news coverage and amazing photography play a vital role in fostering unity and community. Count them – it’s staggering the amount of articles Daniel

writes and though he makes it look easy, it isn’t. It’s time consuming collecting the info and put it intelligently and correctly together. His reports give us all the opportunity to rally behind our teams, celebrate achievements, and build a collective sense of pride. Will Rogers appreciated the printed page: “I read about eight newspapers in a day. When I’m in a town with only one newspaper, I read it eight times.”

I am only one person and I can’t stop the looming storm of change - still I can stand my ground and wave a banner of gratitude. The silencing of many local newspapers is also the elimination of jobs – and regrettably it is the demise of local voices, journalists and readers alike. America writer, Richard Kluger sums it up: “Every time a newspaper dies, even a bad one, the country moves a little closer to authoritarianism...”

Daniel doesn’t know I am writing this, but when he prepares it for inserting into THE LANIGAN ADVISOR, he will. I throw out the challenge to everyone reading this or another newspaper: HAVE YOU THANKED AN EDITOR LATELY? I know writing and editing really is no easy task making those weekly headlines, cut-lines and deadlines. Mark Twain understood this when he said, “The difference between the right word and the almost right word is the difference between lightning and a lightning bug.” But this is also me saying, the difference between spelling someone’s name correctly or messing it up is the difference between criticism and kudos! (And knowing that next week we always get another remarkable opportunity to get it right!)



Minestrone Soup Instant Pot

Ingredients:

2 tbsp. olive oil
1 cup chopped onion
3/4 cup chopped carrot
3/4 cup chopped celery
1 small zucchini - diced
4 cloves minced garlic (about 1 heaping tablespoon)
4 to 6 cups broth (chicken or beef)
1 cup red wine (optional)
4 cups canned chopped tomatoes with juice
1 large can cannellini beans (drained and rinsed)
2 tbsp. tomato paste
2 bay leaves
1 tsp. salt
3/4 tsp. pepper
1 tsp. dried oregano (or 1 tbsp. chopped fresh)
1 tsp. dried basil (or 2 tsp. chopped fresh)
1/2 tsp. thyme
1 tbsp. chopped parsley
1 cup small pasta (shells, macaroni)
1 cup finely chopped spinach (optional)
Parmesan cheese for garnish

4 cups of broth makes a thicker soup; 6 cups broth makes a thinner soup
I often use a large can of mixed baking beans instead of cannellini beans

Directions:

Place all ingredients in the instant pot except salt and pepper, the spinach and Parmesan cheese. Close the lid, set the vent to sealing. Pressure cook to get four minutes. When it beeps then it is done, flip the valve to vent for quick release. If it begins to sputter, do a control release by flipping the valve between seal and vent for about 10 seconds each until pressure is released. When the pin drops, open the pot, remove bay leaves. Stir in the chopped spinach if you are using it. Add the salt and pepper to taste. Pour into bowls, garnish with Parmesan cheese.
