Marian Justine (Wieler) Pullman was born in Swift Current and remained in that area most of her growing up years, attending school in Rosenhof, Wymark and Swift Current. Marian is the second of five children in the family. She is predeceased by her father Cornelius Wieler, mother Margaret, stepdad Jake Wiens, and her brother Bob Wieler. Marian is survived by her husband of 53 years Jerry Pullman, her son Keith Pullman and grandson Ryder, her daughter and son-in-law Kendra and Kent Gulner and grandchildren, Braxten, Majda, and Corbin, her sister Kathleen (Alvin) Meyer, brother Bernie (Doreen) Wieler, sister Connie (Dave) Brown, and many step-family.

Marian attended Briercrest Bible College in 1969. Later she attended the University of Saskatchewan for three years and received a teaching certificate in 1972. She married Jerry Pullman on August 28, 1971 and then moved to Lanigan in 1972. She taught for one year in Guernsey Elementary School and half a year in Lanigan Elementary School. She continued as a substitute teacher over the next 20 years. Her first priority was always her husband Jerry and children Keith and Kendra born in 1974 and 1977. Her loving care made for a lifetime of lasting memories. This love included frequent prayers for her children and grandchildren to have soft hearts towards Jesus whom she knew and loved.

Marian and Jerry spent 50 great years making Lanigan their home. Together they served in the Christian Fellowship Church and were involved in the community. Marian liked making connections with people and developed many lifelong

friendships. She was involved in serving in camps, Sunday School teaching, and leading Pioneer Girls clubs. She enjoyed playing games, reading, watching TV and some needlework. Ever since she was a young child, Marian also loved music and sang often in choirs and trios. As one friend put it "it was part of how she worshiped her Saviour and how she ministered to others". Following Jerry's retirement, the travel adventures began. They spent two years teaching English together in Taiwan. When they returned, they enjoyed many other travels with each other or with friends and family to some parts of Canada and far and abroad. Marian was 11 years old when she prayed with her Mom and accepted Jesus as her Saviour in response to an altar call when an evangelist came to their community. Though she felt her life didn't visibly change much initially, she believed that the Holy Spirit was at work and she continued to have a desire for spiritual growth. Later, at the age of 14 she rededicated her life to God, meaning she "wanted to continue to improve in her walk with Him and serve Him with her gifts."

While Marian will be sadly missed by all her family and friends, we celebrate that she is with the Lord and free of the troubles and health conditions of the past few years.
