




Mary was in the last days of her pregnancy when she and Joseph were forced to leave the security of their home





Smashed Baked Baby Potatoes

Ingredients:

12-14 small potatoes
3 tbsp. olive oil
chives or other herbs you enjoy
Parmesan cheese
salt and pepper sprinkled on

Directions:

Preheat oven to 450°F. Boil the whole potatoes in salted water until tender. It is good to have them the same size so they are all done at the same time. Drain. Drizzle a parchment or foil-lined cookie sheet with olive oil. Put the cooked potatoes on the sheet, leaving room between them. With a potato masher press down on the potatoes until they are slightly smashed. If any potato sticks to the masher, put it back on top of the potato. Two smashes at right angles to each other works just right. Drizzle the tops of the potato generously with olive oil. Sprinkle with salt, pepper and any herbs you enjoy. Sprinkle the Parmesan cheese generously on top. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes until golden brown.

Italian Cheese Bread

Ingredients:

2 1/2 cups flour
1 tsp. sugar
1 cup warm water
1/3 cup Italian salad dressing
1/4 tsp. oregano
1/4 tsp. basil
1/4 tsp. thyme
dash pepper
1 tbsp. Parmesan cheese
1/4 tsp. parsley flakes
1 tsp. salt
1 tbsp. instant yeast
1 tbsp. oil
1/4 tsp. garlic powder
1 2/3-4 cup grated mozzarella cheese

Directions:

Combine flour, sugar, salt and yeast. Mix oil and water and add to flour mixture, knead lightly into a soft dough. You may need a bit more flour. Place in well-oiled bowl, flip over and let rest for 20 minutes in a warm place. Punch down lightly and place in either a 9x13 pan or a 12 inch pizza pan that has been oiled. Using your fingers press into the dough to make indentations. Brush with the Italian salad dressing, sprinkle the spices on top. Sprinkle Parmesan cheese all over the top (you may need a bit more Parmesan). Sprinkle grated mozza on top. Bake at 425°F for 12 to 15 minutes or until golden brown. Best served warm. Fabulous substitute for garlic bread or to serve as an appetizer.






