## Watrous resident receives award for saving lives in Ukraine

Feeling compelled to help after watching the devastation unfold in Ukraine and with a military background, Ron Isabelle of Watrous not only spent some time serving overseas but was recognized for saving lives.

For his selfless efforts, on Remembrance Day, Ron was honoured by the Ukrainian National Federation (UNF) of Canada - Regina Branch during a ceremony in the Queen City. UNF Regina Branch President Elena Schian and UCC Regina President Terry Kuzik presented him

with a Brother for Brother medal for sacrifice, appreciating the efforts made by the Watrous resident for freeing two families under the Russian army's occupation.

"We were going through this town and clearing it of Russian forces," shared Ron of what happened earlier this year. "There was a building across the street from us. Our objective was to take that and once we did, we started going forward to another house but didn't realize in the basement there were two families that the Russian army had done whatever they wanted to them. We didn't find that


out until after the battle was done. Our commander told us there were people in that home and we had no idea. They just wanted to thank us for everything we did because they had no idea what their life was going to be like if they were going to make it out alive or what the army was going to further do to them."

It was that effort during his second tour of duty in Ukraine in which the Canadian earned the medal. "At the ceremony, the people in Regina could not have been more supportive. They thanked me, they hugged me and were really quite thankful I went over."

For foreigners like Ron who received the medal for helping Ukrainian servicemen, the Brother for Brother award was founded in 2016 by the FRAC Charity Foundation, US, including the Gavrilenk family from California. The UNF said, "We are honoured to award foreign citizens who, since 2014, have taken direct part in hostilities and defended the independence, sovereignty and territorial integrity of Ukraine."

With his military experience, when asked why he decided to go to Ukraine twice, the Watrous resident who was stationed mostly at Chatham, New Brunswick during his career said, "There has to be an end to it and somebody has to be helped so I felt that I needed to go over and help."

Council in 2023, the Senior 55 and over art classes given at the Gallery at 3rd, certainly merit the qualification of a great success.


Taught by local artists, the drawing class (nine stu-



part of Team Saskatchewan along with skip Bruce Korte, second Kory Kohuch and lead Rory Golanowski.





residence in Major as part of an ongoing investigation.

Officers located and seized approximately 215 grams of suspected methamphetamine, three firearms, ammunition and trafficking paraphernalia in the residence. An adult male was arrested at the residence.

Forty-one-year-old Willis Kostiuk from Major is charged with 23 offences including possession for the purpose of trafficking, possession of the proceeds of crime and possessing a firearm when prohibited.

### Charges laid

Just after midnight Nov. 15, Yorkton RCMP conducted a traffic stop on Smith Street East in Yorkton as part of a drug trafficking investigation. Officers located and seized approximately 15 individually-wrapped grams of suspected cocaine, unstamped tobacco and a sum of cash.

The driver was arrested. As a result of subsequent investigation, 25-year-old Hunter Seguin from Nanaimo, B.C. is charged with: one count, possession for the purpose of trafficking cocaine, Section 5(2), Controlled Drugs and Substances Act; one count, trafficking cocaine, Section 5(1), Controlled Drugs and Substances Act; and one count, possession of property obtained by crime over \$5,000, Section 354(1)(a), Criminal Code.

He was also charged under the Excise Act for possessing the unstamped tobacco.

Yorkton RCMP's Municipal General Investigation Section assisted with this investigation.

### Robbery in Humboldt

At approximately 11:45 p.m. Nov. 24, Humboldt RCMP received a report of a robbery at a business on 9th Street in Humboldt. Officers immediately responded. Investigation determined an individual entered the

business, threatened an occupant and attempted to rob them. The individual fled without stealing anything. No physical injuries were reported.

Through continued investigation, Humboldt RCMP identified a suspect vehicle and located it parked outside a residence in Humboldt. An adult male was arrested without incident at the residence. A second adult male was later arrested without incident in Middle Lake.

Thirty-seven-year-old Kriston Lins of Middle Lake and 40-year-old Ryan Dempster from Humboldt are each charged with: one count, robbery, Section 344, Criminal Code; one count uttering threats, Section 264.1(1)(a), Criminal Code; and one count, wear disguise with intent to commit offence, Section 351(2), Criminal Code.

### Charges laid after armed individual in residence

At approximately 4:12 a.m. Nov. 26, La Loche RCMP received a report of an armed individual at a residence in La Loche.

Officers immediately responded. Investigation determined an armed male was holding two females against their will in the residence. One of them was able to flee the house.

While officers were setting up a containment area around the house, the male exited the residence. Officers arrested him and seized a handgun.

Officers located the other female inside the residence. Investigation determined she had been assaulted and she was taken to hospital with injuries described as serious in nature.

As a result of further investigation, 28-year-old Tremaine Dacres is charged with 19 offences including aggravated assault and forcible confinement.

Why do you want to know about Jesus? Our reason for enquiring may determine the answer we perceive. What do you want of Jesus? Do you, like Pilate, want to wash your hands of the whole thing and get on living your life your way? Do you want learn from and encounter a good teacher, perhaps picking up something positive for your life? 

# Winterhawks collect win over Braves

With a fight less than 15 seconds into the game and a whole host of penalties assessed to either side, the Watrous Winterhawks and LeRoy Braves found themselves in a physical contest Nov. 28.

After a hit from Watrous which drew an interference call following the opening face off, the gloves came off and just like that a pair of players exited the contest, a game that was just 13 seconds old.

LeRoy was then given a too many players penalty less than two minutes later but Watrous was unable to connect with the power play. Later in the frame, with 2:58 to play, a cross checking penalty was assessed to Watrous while LeRoy received a high sticking minor and an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty. With an opening period filled with hits, physical play and a handful of penalties to both sides, it was the goaltenders who made some big saves to keep their opponents from scoring.

With Adam Dmyterko in net for Watrous and Matt Richard keeping the puck out for LeRoy, after one period of play the shots were 14-7 Winterhawks.

In period two and looking for the opening marker, the visitors were able to solve Dmyterko as Kade Kehoe scored just about four minutes into the frame. Watrous replied less than six minutes later as captain Woody Klassen (#77) along with the Winterhawks collected a 5-2 victory at home over LeRoy Nov. 28.

found themselves in further trouble with a slashing call with 6:18 to go, a double minor for high sticking with 4:45 to play and a cross checking penalty with 2:24 remaining in the second period.

On the penalty kill and trying to keep the score knotted at two, the Winterhawks were able to not only kill off the penalties with solid defensive play but as the period expired, gained momentum heading into the third.

With a number of power play minutes, LeRoy took over the latter part of the second stanza as it tried to take the lead, edging the Winterhawks in the shot department 14-13 but were unable to beat Dmyterko.

In the third period and with its full compliment of skaters, Watrous remained disciplined and stayed out of the penalty box. Despite

carrying the play early on, the Braves received four penalties, two of which the Winterhawks capitalized on.

With 7:30 remaining in the contest and the score still 2-2, Watrous took advantage of the power play and applying pressure in the LeRoy zone, Dylan Smith gave the home crew its first lead of the night as he beat Richard to make it 3-2. While the Braves would ring the puck off the post on two occasions in the third, with time ticking off the clock, Kyle Inkster spotted Andrew Johnston in the slot and the forward made no mistake to push the home team up 4-2 with 2:29 to go.

A slash by LeRoy with 1:46 remaining along with a game misconduct put the Winterhawks back on the power play and with 0.2 on the clock, George King

benefitted from a nice feed from Gage Helm who spotted his linemate at the side of the net and the power play tally made it 5-2. While shots in the third period favoured LeRoy by a 17-11 count, overall, each team put 38 shots on net as both netminders had to be solid.

Following the victory at home, Watrous improved its record to 3-1, tied with Wadena for first in Long Lake Hockey League standings (3-0). Foam Lake sat behind them at 2-0-1 followed by Lanigan (2-3), Wynyard (1-2-2), LeRoy (1-2) and Drake (0-1).

Wanting to lend a hand, the 57-year-old was able to connect with some friends in the military that were already in Ukraine. Heading over for three months a few years ago before returning to Ukraine this past summer for a second tour of duty, Ron was on the ground with a combat scenario every day.

Having days of not much going on and others where there was a lot of action, the overall experience was a scary one for the whole contingent. "You get your morning briefing and it is all bubbly and roses and they say we are all going to come back. Not everybody comes back, that is just the way it is. It is a big surge of adrenaline and a lot of forgetting things that you have learnt. It can be something as simple as reloading your weapon. You will forget in an instant because things are happening so fast. It is just that quick. You have to be able to grasp it, take it all in and take in all your surroundings."

Fighting in the city of Lyman in eastern Ukraine and stationed about 60 kms north of the city of Dnipro with a group called the International Brigade during his first tour and the Ukrainian Foreign Legion during his second time of combat, Ron was not the only one from another country helping Ukraine.

Led by a French-Canadian, other Canadians were also part of the International Brigade while there were some who joined from the United States. During his second tour, this time with the Ukrainian Foreign Legion, the local soldier was the only Canadian in the group while there was representation from Brazil, Singapore, Japan and a few other countries. "It just goes to show that the world is sick of what is happening. Everyone wants to help and everyone wants to see Ukrainians free."

Ron also shared about how civilians are trying to do their best amidst a difficult situation. "People live differently with the war going on. They do what they can to get through with their everyday lives. We were posted in a school. That was where our base was. They were trying to get the teachers to come back to teach school again and this was just 30 miles from the front lines. They wanted some type of normalcy and wanted to do whatever they could to get it. The locals were really good about everything. They accepted us as foreigners coming into their hometown and were quite

happy to have us there."

While wounded from a shell that broke close to him during combat a month into his second tour, despite the injury, which has since healed, the local resident was glad he went but considers himself lucky. "Everyone who I went over with, I was pals with around 10 or 15 people there, and every one except three of us are dead. One is in California and one is from France, who lost his foot, but everyone else was killed in action."

Explaining how so many people have lost their lives because of the fighting, Ron keeps in touch with a family who he helps support in Ukraine. Hearing from them, two family friends and a godfather of one the children from that family were part of a brigade which was totally wiped out except for those three. "They were in a different part of a battle zone when it happened and were the only three out of 330 who lived. War is not what people think it is. It is not a video game. You go out with 10 people and come back with four. It is a totally different set of emotions to deal with but you also have to go on to battle the next day and keep a positive attitude. It is hard to do."

Trying to make a difference and sharing about the severity of the situation, now back in Watrous, Ron has no plans to enlist a third time due to his age and needing to work. Reflecting on his time in the Ukraine, he said people are doing their best to remain resilient.

"They just want normalcy back. Every night we would wake up and hear the sirens and rockets go off near our town where we were posted when we weren't in battle. We had to worry about drones. We used to sit around at night before supper time and every night we would go attack the Russian army across the river and just like clockwork they would turn around and come back and attack us. They would use drones and snipers, whatever they could. It is still hard for me to hear a lawn mower start without my heart skipping a beat because that is what those bigger drones dropping explosives sound like."

Noting how the war is at a stalemate right now with neither Ukraine or Russia gaining, as winter arrives, the man who spent time in Ukraine feels for now "everything will kind of come to a stop. I want people to know how lucky we have it in Canada when our biggest problem is worrying about our raspberry bushes

when there is so much else going on around the world. There is paper work we found from Russian officers wanting nuclear war against the rest of the world. People don't know how close we were actually to coming to a third world war."


