Papa T's Ice Cream Parlour serving up sweet treats

Wanting to be known for having the best ice cream around, Papa T's Ice Cream Parlour has set up shop in Watrous.

Operating a confectionery store for a number of years that grew in popularity, Terry Galay

(who is Papa T) along with his wife Christina, are hoping to bring that same type of flavour to Watrous. "In Norquay where we are originally from, our claim to fame was we had the best ice cream around for 100 kms. We want to bring that here."

Offering soft serve

ice cream, 16 flavours of hard ice cream, ice cream sandwiches, sundaes, banana splits, slush puppies, iced caps, and coffee, when the Galays moved to Watrous, Terry said a number of people shared about the famous soft serve ice cream from the Burger Corral. "They remember how good that ice cream was and we want to try and bring that tradition back to the community."

Set up inside Green Acres Greenhouse at 704 4th Ave. E. in Watrous, Papa T's is open seven days a week right through the summer. "Mel Penrose from Green Acres Greenhouse has been very gracious to us," said Christina. "When she closes for the season, we will still be here every day in the summer from 1 to 9 p.m."

Asked why people should come and visit Papa T's Ice Cream Parlour, Terry said, "It is the quality and taste. Our hard ice cream is premium ice cream from Foothills Creamery out of Calgary.

They provide a good product that is creamy. The first ingredient is buttermilk, whereas most commercial ice creams have sugar as the first ingredient."

Wanting to ensure each customer has a positive experience when they come in, Christina added they set the bar high when it comes to their products. "If there is something we don't like, we change it. One example is we now have a local lady making us apple crisp. We serve that homemade item as part of our apple crisp sundaes. When we are not satisfied with a product, we don't just say, 'Oh well, it is good enough.' We find a way to improve it."

Featuring daily specials throughout July and August along with carrying gift certificates and having a presence on Facebook, the couple are also turning back the clock to bring a bit of nostalgia to their customers. "Being an ice cream parlour we want to provide something that people are familiar with from years ago when they visited ice cream parlours. We recently did banana splits which is something from our childhood and we want to bring some of those ice cream parlour type things in. We also

RCMP Report

Watrous RCMP locate McNeice

Watrous RCMP have located Curtis McNeice alive. After receiving information from the public, around 6:45 a.m. July 1, RCMP found McNeice on an area highway northeast of Watrous.

McNeice was reported missing to police Monday, June 26 after he told family he was going kayaking on Little Manitou Lake. They called police when he did not return as expected.

The kayak was recovered June 27 and Watrous RCMP had been searching the water and shore for McNeice with the assistance of area residents, Humboldt Fire Department, Saskatoon Police Service's Air Support Unit, the Civilian Air Search and Rescue Association (CASARA), the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency and the Search and Rescue Saskatchewan Association of Volunteers.

The Watrous RCMP thanks the public for their help in locating McNeice and for the support they received during the search.

RCMP respond to three collisions

Saskatchewan RCMP responded to three fatal collisions over the long weekend (June 30 to July 2).

At approximately 10:30 p.m. June 30, Wadena RCMP received a report of a single vehicle rollover on Fishing Lake First Nation. The driver, who was the sole occupant of the vehicle, passed away at the scene. He has been identified as a 52-year-old male from Fishing Lake First Nation. His family has been notified.

At approximately 3:30 p.m. June 30, Beauval RCMP received a report of a single vehicle rollover on Canoe Road, south of Canoe Narrows, Sask. The driver and sole occupant of the vehicle passed away at the scene. He has been identified as a 27-year-old male from Beauval. His family has been notified.

At approximately 5:15 a.m. July 2, Morse RCMP received a report of a motor vehicle collision on Hwy. 1, near Chaplin, Sask. Investigation determined the vehicle left the roadway and came to rest in a body of water. The adult male driver passed away at the scene. He has been identified as a 36-year-old male from Sherwood Park, Alta. His family has been notified. The adult female passenger was transported to hospital via STARS with injuries described as serious.

The collisions remain under investigation; Saskatchewan RCMP collision reconstructionists and the Saskatchewan Coroners Service are assisting.

RCMP busy during Canada Day weekend

Combined Traffic Services Saskatchewan officers were out Canada Day long weekend, targeting unsafe behaviour like speeding, aggressive driving, impaired driving,

distracting driving and improper seat belt use.

Between June 30 at 5 p.m. and July 3 at 11:59 p.m., CTSS officers:

- removed 14 impaired drivers from the road (two were charged with impaired driving under the Criminal Code and 12 were issued driver's licence suspensions for having a blood alcohol content between .04 to .08 or drug impairment);
- issued 795 tickets. These included: 404 speeding tickets; 40 cellphone use tickets; 39 seatbelt infraction tickets; and 45 tickets for invalid registration (35 for vehicles and 10 for trailers);
- issued 42 vehicle defect inspection notices; and
- gave out 704 warnings.

RCMP arrest and charge driver

RCMP officers with Yorkton Combined Traffic Services Saskatchewan were conducting proactive patrols on Hwy. 1 near Indian Head.

At approximately 12:15 p.m. June 29, officers observed a vehicle with illegal tint and initiated a traffic stop. As a result of further observations during this traffic stop, officers searched the vehicle and located and seized approximately 10 kilograms of opium poppy pods.

As a result, the driver of the vehicle, 26-year-old Jagraj Singh from Brampton, Ont. was arrested and charged with one count, possession for the purpose of trafficking, Section 5(2), Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. He made his first appearance in Regina Provincial Court on June 30, 2023. Saskatchewan RCMP's Roving Traffic Unit and Saskatchewan Ministry of Finance Revenue Enforcement assisted in this investigation.

Former IHRC executive director honoured for her leadership

Making a difference in their communities and the lives of others, over 100 people including local resident Deborah Farago were recently awarded with a Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal.

Given to those who have made contributions to Canada, Saskatchewan, or to a particular region or community, the medal was created to celebrate the 70th anniversary year of Her Majesty, the late Queen Elizabeth II's Accession to the Throne. It was also made as a tangible way for the province of Saskatchewan to honour Her Majesty for her service to Canada.

Nominating those who have made a significant contribution to the Disability Service Sector, SARC hosted a call for nominations from its members resulting in 107 people receiving the prestigious honour at an awards ceremony June 23 in Regina.

An integral part of Interlake Human Resources Corporation (IHRC) and SARCAN in Watrous for a number of years, when the call for nominations was issued by SARC, members of IHRC in Watrous submitted Debbie's name.

Receiving the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal for leadership in Saskatchewan's Disability Sector, on behalf of IHRC, Board Chair Margie Borsheim and Executive Director Angela Silzer shared the nomination letter the agencies compiled for Farago:

"It gives our agencies - IHRC and SARCAN - great pleasure to nominate our

former executive director Deborah Farago for this prestigious medal.

Debbie Farago is synonymous with IHRC/ SARCAN and has been with our organization for 25 years. Debbie was our executive director from 2000 until her retirement at the end of 2022. Debbie is a gifted visionary, a can-do person. Combined with her perseverance, her management and leadership skills, Debbie is responsible for the solid foundation, growth and many of the successes our

IHRC/SARCAN agencies enjoy today.

Debbie has been a true champion of and tireless advocate for persons with intellectual disabilities, not only at the local level but provincially as well. She has served on numerous panels, committees and planning sessions for provincial training, language literacy project and government panels to name a few.

Debbie has made a lasting and meaningful contribution to our IHRC/ SARCAN agencies, to our

participants' lives and the communities in which we operate.



BBQ Pizza

Ingredients:

Naan Bread
Diced meat . . . ham, pepperoni, etc.
Pizza sauce
Choice of veggies - peppers, onion, mushrooms, pineapple chunks, etc.
Shredded cheese

Directions:

Preheat barbecue to high. Lower heat to low. Make up pizza according to taste. Naan, then pizza sauce spread thinly, then meat, veggies and topped with shredded cheese.
Barbecue on grill until the cheese is melted. The veggies will remain crunchy, if you prefer them fully cooked, then sauté them a bit before placing on the pizza.

When this happened to me (she often says); I finally figured out that the eggs were not room temperature. That is the most important step when whipping egg whites. The other secret is to add one-quarter teaspoon cream of tartar (for two eggs) before whipping; this step will help stabilize the eggs. Lastly, you will increase your chances of success if you make meringue on a dry, sunny day because humidity can also affect the result.

Dear Reena,

I often hear people talk about straining food using a cheesecloth. What is a cheesecloth used for? Drew

Dear Drew,

People who make their own cheese use cheesecloths to remove whey from cheese curds. Before using a new cheesecloth, rinse it to remove dust and debris. A cheesecloth is also handy for clarifying stocks, making yogurt, bundling herbs for dropping into soup stock and for making tofu.

to prevent ants from getting in the house. Thanks! Betty
Dear Betty,

Begin by finding out where the ants are getting in. Do you need to seal doors or windows? Are there cracks in the foundation that need repair? Ants are attracted to food and so if you own pets and pet food sits out all day or their food is stored in open containers, chances are that you will have ants.

One very simple trick for homeowners without pets is to make a solution of 'Ant Away'. Combine one cup Borax and two tablespoons icing sugar into a bowl or shaker. Place the container in areas away from pets, kids and hungry neighbours because Borax is toxic if ingested. You can sprinkle over concrete cracks outside of doorways. I did this and have not seen an ant since. If your ant problem continues, spray ant killer with a two residual or call exterminators before the problem gets out of hand.

Fabulous tip of the week

• Add honey to whipped cream in place of sugar. One teaspoon of honey adds a sweet delicious flavour and the whipped cream stays firm longer.

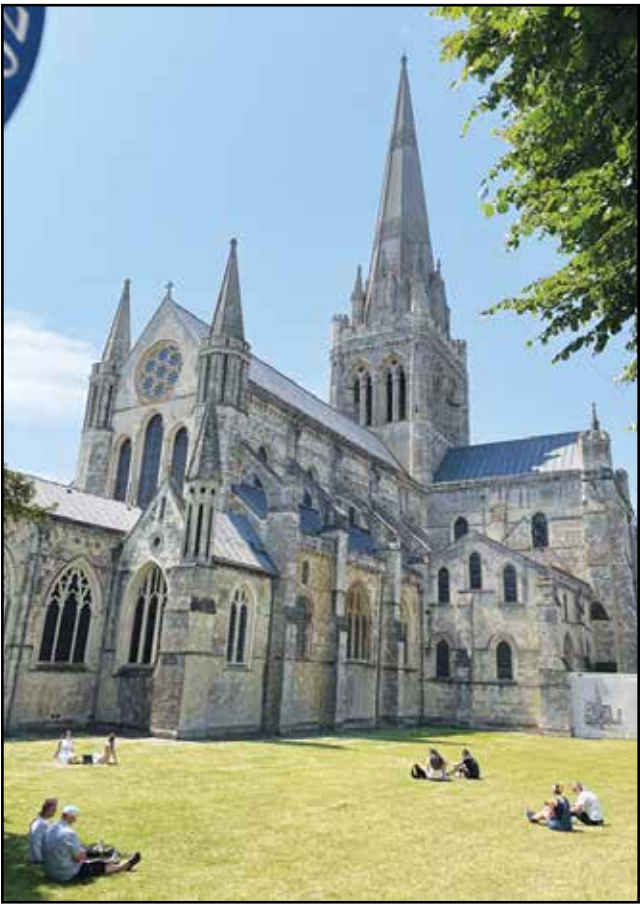
The Young swimming pool was on track to open July 3. Several staff members have severe nut allergies therefore the pool will be completely nut free. Please keep this in mind when packing lunches.

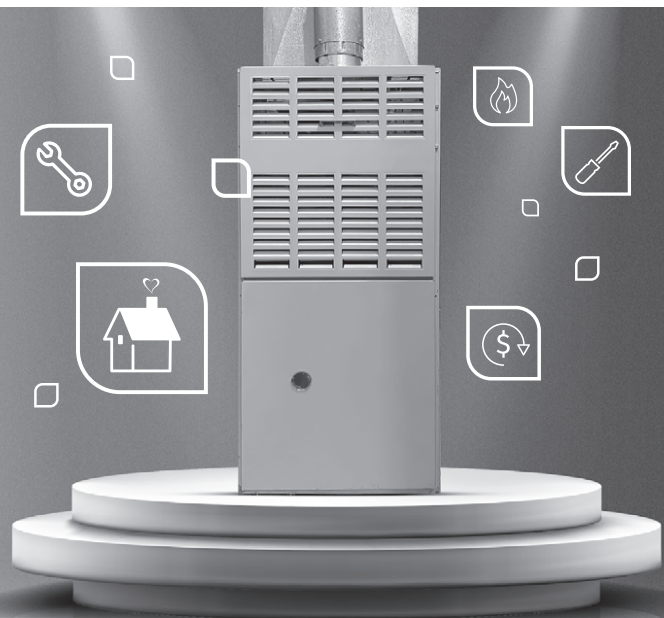

would put out quite strong wind gusts. That is one of the main (things to signify) a severe thunderstorm, especially with the damage that was reported.”

As damage varied depending where you went, power was knocked out in a number of areas. Joel Cherry with SaskPower said throughout the outage there were more than 20,000 customers without power spanning a large area including Prince Albert, Nipawin, Melfort, and Carrot River. As of Tuesday afternoon, Cherry said most of those customers had power restored but a larger issue remained. With a transmission line off after being damaged by the wind, Cherry explained crews were working to fix the line Tuesday afternoon which fed the Carrot River and Tobin Lake areas. Once completed it would restore power to around 1,400 customers.

“We appreciate our customers’ patience. It is never convenient when the power goes out and it is especially the case when it is out for a couple of days like it has been in this case. So we appreciate our customers’ patience as we work to get the power back on as quickly and safely as we can.”

As Saskatchewan dealt with high winds, severe hail, thunderstorms and power outages, in Alberta, a tornado created substantial damage. Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) said the afternoon tornado occurred July 1 between Didsbury and Carstairs with a preliminary assessment of the tornado indicating it was an EF-4 (estimated winds of 275 km/h).

Reported just southwest of Didsbury around 1:45 p.m., ECCC stated the tornado appeared to weaken briefly before re-intensifying as it moved east. The heaviest damage was reported where the tornado crossed Highway 2A between Didsbury and Carstairs before weakening near the QE2 Highway.

Once it dissipated, in total 12 homes were damaged,

three of which were completely destroyed and four left uninhabitable. The most notable damage according to ECCC occurred at a farm on the west side of Highway 2A. A well-constructed home was destroyed in this location with all exterior and above-grade interior walls knocked down. The homeowner was in the house at the time and took shelter in the basement. No fatalities were reported.

ECCC indicated the length of the tornado track was 15.3 km with a width of 620 m and lasted an estimated 30 minutes. The most recent Alberta tornado with an equivalent rating according to ECCC was the Edmonton Tornado in 1987.

With a number of recent severe weather events occurring in both Saskatchewan and Alberta, Berg said usually there is a two week period before and after the Canada Day long weekend which is typically the peak time for the Canadian prairies to experience severe thunderstorms.

Berg also touched on the shift in temperatures as July 1 sat at a toasty 29.7°C before the storms and then dropped five to 10 degrees cooler than normal by July 4. “The temperature dip is a common after effect of a severe weather system with a large temperature difference from one side to the other.”

ECCC said a number of places in Saskatchewan set or tied daily minimum temperature records July 5 including the Last Mountain Lake area hitting 3.7°C with the previous record being set in 1992 of 5.5°C. The Watrous area also broke a record with a preliminary new record of 4.2°C for July 5, besting the previous mark of 7.2°C set in 1971.

Despite the cooler values the forecast had the warmer values returning in time for the second weekend of July. As for how the remainder of summer will go, Berg said the outlook indicates warmer than normal.



PUBLIC NOTICE

SaskWater's District Operations will be treating the water in the Saskatoon Southeast Water Supply System (SSEWS) canal to control the growth of weeds and algae during the 2023 irrigation season.

These treatments will take place approximately every two weeks from May to September, 2023.

The chemical used in these treatments is called Magnacide "H". It is a registered aquatic herbicide that has been approved by the Water Security Agency for use in the SSEWS canal system.

It will remain active in the water for approximately 24 hours after each treatment and will diminish to non-detectable levels prior to treated water entering the reservoirs. Treated water may also be harmful to the skin, causing irritation to exposed areas.

This water treatment helps to prevent irrigation intakes from clogging and ensures adequate flows are maintained in this multi-use system.

Dosages will be maintained at a level where the water can safely be used for irrigation with no damage to field crops.

Please ensure that people are reminded that swimming, canoeing and fishing in the canal at any time is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.
