Imperial celebrates grand reopening of local arena during Rock'n The Rink

Following tremendous support, countless hours of volunteering and assistance through funding initiatives, the community of Imperial came together to celebrate the official grand reopening of its arena.

With the \$906,138 upgrade allowing the facility to be used throughout the year, during the first Rock'n The Rink event June 10, Town of Imperial Administrator Joslin Freeman said the project represented countless hours of planning, designing and construction with the intention of having a space that can be enjoyed by everyone. "We believe that by providing such a diverse facility, we are nurturing the growth of talent, fostering community spirit and promoting healthy living."

Beginning March 2022, construction on the arena involved pouring a new concrete floor for the rink surface to replace the existing gravel floor, installing new ice rink boards and reusing the existing glass. Through community volunteers stepping up in a big way during various stages of the project, work wrapped up in December 2022.

Expressing her gratitude to the engineers, contractors, volunteers and all those who dedicated their expertise and efforts to bring the vision to life, Freeman also extended an extra special thank you to Town of Imperial Foreman Kelvin Klenk. "His commitment and time went above and beyond. The commitment to excellence and the attention to detail are evident in every inch of this remarkable transformation."

Freeman also shared how the late Gary Mooney's generosity touched the hearts of many as the new tin on the walls was done through financial donations in his name.

Citing the project as a symbol of the community's strength, resilience, and unwavering commitment to progress, Freeman said, "Today we inaugurate not just a refurbished ice rink but a new chapter in our community's history."

In addition to the work done to the facility, a Sask. Parks and Rec Association Framework For Action grant of \$5,000 was also awarded to Imperial, allowing them to purchase pickleball nets and paddles, a basketball hoop, lacrosse and floor hockey sticks, badminton net and racquets and a volleyball system for the rink. "We are welcoming the community to utilize this new space and encourage physical activity."

With the Government of Canada investing \$350,914, the Government of Saskatchewan contributing \$292,399 and the Town of Imperial funding the remaining \$262,825, Imperial Mayor Edward Abrey was very pleased to be part of the official grand reopening.

Joined by other members of council, Abrey indicated



and others, it is fantastic.

"The Government of Saskatchewan's more than \$290,000 in provincial funding toward the Town of Imperial's arena upgrade project improved this key local infrastructure so it can now be used throughout the year," said Skoropad, on behalf of the Honourable Don McMorris, the province's Minister of Government Relations. "The facility's new sturdy concrete floor not only makes this facility stronger, but also strengthens the heart of this community, as people can now gather more frequently and build even fonder memories of this special part of Saskatchewan."

While unable to attend the event, in a statement, the Honourable Dominic LeBlanc, Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Infrastructure and Communities said on behalf of the federal government, "Arenas are at the heart of rural communities across Canada, and Imperial is no exception. With the reopening of the Town's beloved arena, residents of all ages will now

Watrous family facing obstacles during difficult journey

I am Candace Whitfield's sister, Paula Halstead, and at this time, we are wanting to share Candace's health journey and gain awareness about what the family is going through. Times have been extremely hard for Candace, her husband Lindsay and their resilient twin boys, Cannan and Easton, who are just six years old.

Candace Whitfield, daughter of Garth and Patti Gronsdahl began her LPN nursing career in Saskatoon in November of 2008. She was always the type of person who would get sick frequently even as a child, and pick up every little thing; however,

she began rapidly losing weight in 2014 with not trying and was unsure of the actual reason why. She had frequent colds, sinus infections, and bronchitis, all while she was going back to school and in her third year for Registered Nursing. She was living in Martensville, planning a wedding and thought perhaps it was the stress with both wedding planning and going to school.

Candace got married in August of 2015 to Lindsay Whitfield and in March of 2016, with Candace still going to school to obtain her nursing degree, she and Lindsay found out they were expecting. She made plans to postpone school while starting their family and would

return to school after Her pregnancy turned out to be extremely high risk and life changing for herself in so many ways, truly unveiling a series of health complications. At a nine-week ultrasound they found out they were expecting twins! During that time she was experiencing a lot of fatigue, nose bleeds, petechias, bruising, and had blood work drawn to find out she had platelets that were critically low at only 16! She then met with a hematologist who diagnosed her with CVID (Common Variable Immune Deficiency) after a lot of extensive bloodwork and specialized lab tests.

Due to her high-risk pregnancy, Candace was eventually put on

restrictions for work, and eventually was put off work all together. She got very sick in August and was diagnosed with pneumonia. An X-ray confirmed she had lung nodules from so many infections and multiple times with pneumonia. Because of that, Candace knew she would not be able to return to work as an LPN with such close patient contact.

With work restrictions in place (including no more than eight-hour shifts and no direct patient care), Candace had to take a position where she wouldn't be classified as an LPN, and unfortunately wouldn't be making the LPN wage either. She began working as a unit assist, which was definitely a decrease in wage, but she

at St. Paul's Hospital full time. She had one education day and one orientation day and ended up with pneumonia. An X-ray confirmed she had lung nodules from so many infections and multiple times with pneumonia. Because of that, Candace knew she would not be able to return to work as an LPN with such close patient contact.

Since her diagnosis of CVID, the only treatment that is available is to replace her Immunoglobulins (IGG), but she has always been at risk despite receiving monthly treatments in hospital for IGG. In November of 2016 she delivered her twin boys, Cannan and Easton, born at 35 weeks and three days! Cannan was in the NICU for about two weeks and Easton came home with them after a little over a week in hospital.

In spring of 2017 she had taken training to do her own Immunoglobulin treatments subcutaneously at home. Fast forward through her BUSY maternity leave, she returned to her position

was just happy to be able to work, support her family and pay the bills.

After having some continued abnormal lab values (liver enzymes and abdominal pain), a CT scan was performed where they found out Candace had an enlarged liver and spleen. She had to have three splenic artery aneurysms removed as she had a high risk of them rupturing. After being operated on, Candace hasn't worked for the health region since November of 2018.

Her husband Lindsay was laid off from his electrician job while Candace was in hospital due to low demand within

RCMP locate missing person

On June 12, RCMP located missing 33-year-old Justin Lounsbury.

Justin who was located safe had been last seen in Manitou Beach on May 31, 2023 at approximately 3 or 4 p.m. and Watrous RCMP had been searching for him since the report was received June 1.

The driver of the semi did not report any injuries to police. Hwy. 6 was closed during initial investigation.



In the past, Biblical names like Peter, James, John, Esther, Mary, etc. were favourite name choices for the arrival of a newborn baby. Today Biblical names are still frequently popular.

The dark side of positive Biblical names is that we may be more suited to Biblical names that come with a record of shame rather than fame. Usually,

people do not call their sons Cain. Cain has the distinction of murdering his brother Able. Cain was doomed to be a restless wanderer on the earth because he was angry at God for rejecting his gift but accepting his brother's offering. How many times could our name be Cain because we are upset because our efforts are rejected, but a brother or sister has been recognized and celebrated?

It has been my experience that few people are innocent of holding grudges, some small and some deep, long, and festering. Herodias, the wife of King Herod, held a deep,

festering grudge towards John the Baptist. Mark 16:17-20 states, "For Herod himself had given orders to have John arrested, and he had him bound and put in prison. He did this because of Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, whom he had married. For John had been saying to Herod, 'It is not lawful for you to have your brother's wife.' So, Herodias nursed a grudge against John and wanted to kill him. But she could not because Herod feared John and protected him, knowing him to be a righteous and holy man. When Herod heard John, he was greatly puzzled; yet he liked to listen to him."

The desire to get back at someone who has offended or hurt us is an intense desire in our flesh or human nature. The religious leaders were offended by Jesus and envied his popularity with the people. They dismissed that Jesus could be the Messiah. They felt that he threatened their authority and position and had him crucified. Resentment can gradually become deadly hatred and murder. It is an excellent power source for the devil to destroy many lives when animosity becomes consuming hate, as in the case of Herodias.

In time she got her opportunity to kill John

the Baptist. King Herod made a drunken promise to Herodias' daughter because she danced well before the king and his dinner guests. The king promised to give the girl whatever she asked for, up to half his kingdom.

Herodias told her daughter to ask for John the Baptist's head on a platter: Yes, Herodias got John's head on a platter from her daughter. Her resentment proved to be evil. So, let us all pray: "And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil." May God help us to repent when our names are Cain or Herodias.

With unique amenities and attractions rarely found elsewhere in the world aided by a welcoming prairie atmosphere and a plethora of summer events, it is no wonder why thousands of people spend time at Manitou Beach and Watrous.

Following a resurgence of visitors to the local area before the pandemic abruptly hit, with the summer arriving in 2023, many residents and guests are hoping to take in all that Manitou Beach and Watrous has to offer.

The CDO added on top of those events, there is something happening every weekend throughout the summer. "I feel that also adds to the uniqueness of Watrous Manitou. I'm not sure where else in Saskatchewan you would find this much going on in one area. There are also weekly offerings such as Toonie Tuesday at Danceland, open mic night at Mercredi's Stage, Thursday night bingos, live music and entertainment at Little Manitou Art Gallery on Saturdays and Manitou poetry trail tour on Sundays."

Learning more about businesses in Watrous and Manitou Beach on a more detailed scale, Rolheiser was quick to point out another place for people to visit. "Manitou Waters naturopathic clinic is a hidden gem at Manitou Beach. You really need to stop by for a tour and inquire about the services offered, especially if you are taking a health focused vacation. I think both visitors and residents will find that there is always something different to do whether it is events, the business offerings as well as attractions."

Then there is the water at Manitou Beach. Attracting people to the area from around the world, swimming in the 'healing waters' of Little Manitou Lake is a must try. Floating in the calm waters or embarking on a kayak trip across the lake, Rolheiser said the water looks great this year. "There were some concerns in 2022 because the water was deemed unsafe to swim in. I have had some questions already about whether it is safe or not to swim in and from what I have seen, it is clear and beautiful. If something changes, signage will be posted along the shore indicating the water is unsafe but as of now, it looks great!"

Along with unique opportunities like swimming in the lake and looking at-

tract more people to the area, Rolheiser shared about an exciting project the local marketing group has underway. "Experience Manitou packages is something we have created. We have a couple available for purchase on our website and we are in the midst of creating more for all seasons, making it an even easier decision to visit Watrous and Manitou Beach."

Connecting the pair of communities together through events, business and attractions, Rolheiser said people can also enjoy a walk or bike ride along Memory Trail, going from one place to the other. "Having the new trail really gives us that visual of the two operating as one destination area. We hope those from near and far continue to take advantage of all the wonderful things we have here."

Twenty-one district artists all set for their 2023 Studio Trail show





the industry in Saskatoon and the area. With both not working and trying to support their little family on EI and disability payments, times were tough and remain that way!

Forced to find work outside of his education, in March of 2019 Lindsay applied for a job as the foreman for the Resort Village of Manitou Beach, meaning a lesser wage and driving from Martensville. A decision was made and Candace and Lindsay along with their twin boys moved in with Candace's parents, Patti and Garth Gronsdahl in Watrous. With their boys now two and a half years old, the family went back and forth to Martensville on the weekends to get their house ready to sell. In September of 2019 they bought a home for themselves in Watrous.

Candace was still having abdominal pain and began having frequent diarrhea with weight loss, nausea and vomiting; all along with her chronic lung/sinus issues. She was seeing a GI specialist but they had no real answers as to why she was having all those symptoms. In December of 2019 she was still having GI issues and was admitted to hospital for severe electrolyte imbalance and norovirus. Candace required IV replacements and still had no results from her colonoscopy/gastroscopy. Discharged about a week later, she arrived home in time for Christmas with her boys.

In February of 2020, Candace was diagnosed with Celiac disease. She switched to a gluten free lifestyle but healing was very difficult and she had severe electrolyte and vitamin/nutritional deficiencies and malabsorption issues. In March, she began having numbness in her hands, and contractures in her hands and arms and had difficulty with forming speech. She also experienced nausea, vomiting and diarrhea. Candace was taken to hospital via ambulance for another electrolyte imbalance and had another hospital stay with IV replacements and fluids. She saw a dietitian and had nerve conduction studies for the neuropathy issues in her hands. With the 2020 Covid pandemic in full swing, Candace had to stay in her bubble and not leave the house unless it was absolutely necessary or for appointments.

In June of 2020 she was still having numbness and tingling in her hands with no real improvement since March of the same year. The numbness had spread to her feet, lower legs and up to her mid-thigh. She was having difficulty getting around her house and doing things independently and began having some falls in her home. She was admitted again to hospital for another electrolyte imbalance due to celiac malabsorption issues and received IV replacements and was again, in and out of hospital. In July she was admitted to hospital and an

MRI showed severe abnormality of her dorsal column, likely due to deficiency of copper, zinc and vitamin E which was due to her celiac disease. She was given IV replacements of copper for five days in hospital for a total of two weeks due to electrolytes and a neuro problem. She was having a lot of difficulty with walking and balance and needed to use a walker to safely get around.

Sent home with a walker from hospital at just 32 years of age, it was a very difficult summer for her family and the pandemic definitely didn't help.

Since then, Candace has continued to have a multitude of infections, pneumonias, and malabsorption issues with never really responding well to her celiac diet. She still continues to have frequent hospital stays, and more health complexity.

Feeling there has to be a missing diagnosis, fast forward to present day, Lindsay has changed jobs and is currently employed at Minard's Leisure World in Watrous. Candace's body is very malnourished and is getting quite played out. Continuing to have abdominal pain, weakness, numbness, frequent diarrhea and vomiting, on Apr. 26th, 2023, she spent part of the day in hospital getting her electrolytes replaced. She then got a call that they finally had a room for her in Regina at the TPN clinic.

Packing up their bags and heading off to Regina to learn how to give herself TPN (Intravenous nutrition), Candace was told she would only be there for two to three weeks to completely learn how to give herself this treatment. Her treatment was going well and she was beginning to gain weight but her liver was beginning to have some troubles processing the full calorie treatment.

Since then, more complications have arisen including a hip fracture after a fall in hospital, abdominal swelling, fluid retention, and more infections. After four weeks in Regina, she was transferred to Saskatoon to be a little closer to home.

These past few weeks have proven to be her hardest yet. She has developed another infection which required fluid having to be drained off her abdomen. She is still in hospital and has spent over two weeks in the ICU where she has been sedated with a breathing tube and abdomen drain. She was initially in the ICU for a full week and did make progress, having her breathing tube removed. She remained on oxygen and was closely monitored but three days after her breathing tube was removed, she had some setbacks. On Monday, June 12th a breathing tube was put back in while her sedation is being lessened.

When Candace is awake and alert, she is able to use a pen and paper to communicate a little bit as she cannot speak with the breathing tube in. Candace is so frustrated and upset, but

still remains positive and just wants to keep making progress. She is truly a warrior! She is doing okay for now, but praying she rebounds from this now too.

Over these past seven weeks as you can imagine it has been extremely difficult on our family, especially Lindsay, Cannan and Easton. Patti and Lindsay have been taking turns going back and forth to each city and staying with Candace as she was truly unable to manage being in hospital alone with no supports. Between Garth, Lindsay, Patti and sometimes great grandparents and aunts, Cannan and Easton have been a bit back and forth between households, all while attending kindergarten. They have been visiting Candace here and there but only for a few hours, as hospitals just aren't that fun to be in.

Many people have asked how they can help or what they can do for Candace or Lindsay. Anyone wishing to help is welcome to make a monetary donation to assist their family through this time via E-transfer (direct deposit setup). With Lindsay being back and forth so much between the hospitals, he has been having to take off a lot of time off of work to continue to be available for

Candace and her medical teams. We are so grateful that his colleagues at Minard's have been so understanding and accommodating of his work absences. We are hoping to provide Candace and Lindsay with a bit of a financial cushion that will allow them to focus on healing and rehabilitation; without having to worry on how to make ends meet. These funds would in turn help them provide assistance with medical expenses, hospital parking, potential hotels or accommodations around the hospitals, meals, fuel, etc.

Candace continues to remain so strong and her doctor from Regina said it best when he told her, "In my career as a doctor I have never had a patient who has had so many troubles, been so young and complex and yet remain so positive!"

If you are able, we would be very grateful if you would keep the family in your thoughts and prayers.




