## Liquor store in Watrous closes after permit auction conducted

With 14 bidders and 170 bids reaching a final bid of \$724,500, as the auction for the liquor permit for Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority's (SLGA) Watrous location came to a conclusion, after opening in 1982, the business on 2nd Ave. E. closed its doors one final time.

While not the highest bid nor the lowest of the 35 permits up for grabs in the province, along with the permit in Watrous (which does not include the building itself), bids for the 35 totalled \$45,077,800, ranging from \$450,000 in Carlyle to \$3,270,000 in LaRonge.

As to who was awarded with each, according to SLGA, applicant names for liquor permits are not considered public until a permit is issued. Successful bidders also have up to 18 months to obtain their permit and open for business.

Conducted through McDougall Auctions during the majority of February, SLGA said winning bidders will now begin the application process for the retail store permit. Prospective retailers must meet all SLGA licensing requirements to hold a permit. Timelines for issuance of permits will vary, depending how soon prospective retailers submit and meet all application requirements, secure locations, hire staff and make other preparations to open for business. Bid amounts must also be fully paid before a permit is issued.

"We are pleased to see these auctions come to a successful conclusion," Minister Responsible for SLGA Lori Carr said. "The incredible amount of interest means that we will have additional revenue to put toward the high-quality public services we all enjoy."

Working over 20 years at the liquor store in Watrous, most recently as manager, Cheryl Veld said it was an emotional past few months for her and employees Jasmine Schmidt, Levi Sutherland and Tamara Bergen.

"To say the least, we were astounded when we found out that government-owned stores would be closing by March 2023. I had thought in the back of my mind it might happen one day but I didn't think it would be this quick and abrupt."

Sharing customers also felt blindsided by the announcement, Veld added the close to 400 workers across the province losing their jobs was also tough to take. "Staff at all stores felt so bad for our customers, they had so many questions, and we did not have answers. It was a very emotional time for everyone."

According to the provincial government, in 2018-19, profits for its SLGA Retail were \$9.4 million and in 2021-22, they had declined to \$3.2 million. SLGA Retail's projected net income for 2022-23 was pegged at \$395,000 so in order to maintain profitability, the government indicated many of the stores needed to either be relocated or physically adapted to better meet customer needs. Because of that

and with the dip in profits, the decision was made by government to decommission its stores and complete a transition of liquor retailing to the private sector.

"There was not much we could do," explained Veld following the announcement that the Watrous permit would be auctioned off. "We have a great team through SLGA who kept us informed with the limited information they had and it helped us to try and understand and assist our customers with any questions they had."

With permits listed for auction and the imminent closure of the stores throughout Saskatchewan, that meant Veld and her staff had to begin the task of clearing out product in Watrous. As the shelves became bare and the final day of business arrived, Cheryl and her staff wanted to express their appreciation to the many customers.

"It was an honour to enjoy the great visits, chats, stories, smiles, kindness and patience all of our customers have shown. Watrous and area customers you will be missed. I have more than enjoyed my years at the store and now officially have run out of tears for a while."

Veld also wanted to extend her appreciation to the SLGA team, former manager, regional manager, mentor and friend Ed Collins and Cheryl's staff. "I have grown

personally and professionally during my career with you all. I really found we were not just people working, we were a team and there for each other."

As of Feb. 27, a total of 27 of SLGA Retail Inc.'s liquor stores had closed with the final seven shutting down by the end of business Mar. 11. For affected staff, SLGA shared it will work with the Saskatchewan Government and General Employees' Union (SGEU) to negotiate a workforce adjustment plan.

Along with Watrous, other SLGA stores ceasing operations are located in: Assiniboia, Biggar, Buffalo Narrows, Carlyle, Creighton, Esterhazy, Estevan, Fort Qu'Appelle, Humboldt, La Loche, La Ronge, Meadow Lake, Melfort, Moose Jaw, Moosomin, Nipawin, North Battleford, Prince Albert (two), Regina (six), Saskatoon (five), Swift Current, Weyburn, and Yorkton.

Owning 19 properties of the locations announced, SLGA indicated it will be making the vacant buildings available for sale in a separate process as the empty physical buildings do not include a liquor permit.

The sale of the permits will not impact SLGA's Distribution Centre as SLGA will continue to operate as the wholesaler of beverage alcohol for the province as well as the regulator of liquor, gaming and cannabis.

# “RCMP Report”

## Fuel thefts up 70 percent in 2022

In 2022, Saskatchewan RCMP received approximately 818 reports of thefts of fuel (diesel and/or gas), an increase of approximately 70 percent as compared to 2021.

These reports were received from all across the province and include:

- 510 reports of someone

fuelling up a vehicle at a service station, then leaving without paying. (Note: this excludes reports where investigation determined the person left without paying due to misunderstanding or oversight.)

- 117 of reports of theft from large fuel tanks or heavy machinery, either by siphoning or drilling the

tank.

- 106 reports of theft from bulk fuel tanks at businesses, farms, or rural municipalities.
- the remainder include reports including thefts of jerry cans and similar containers.

Saskatchewan RCMP received reports of fuel thefts from across the province. The detachments with the highest number of reports are Battlefords (61), Saskatoon (58), Shellbrook (46) and Swift Current (39).

Reports of fuel thefts have continued in 2023, including two incidents of gas tank drilling reported to Punnichy RCMP Feb. 27.

Saskatchewan RCMP offers the following tips to

help prevent fuel theft:

- lock privately-owned fuel tanks and ensure the area they are located is well lit;
- set up video or photo surveillance in areas where you have a privately-owned fuel tank;
- if possible, park vehicles in a locked garage or outbuilding or park in a well-lit, frequently-travelled location;
- park with your fuel door facing a frequently-travelled road;
- if possible, do not park in one area or leave a vehicle unattended for an extended period of time; and
- if your vehicle has an alarm, activate it when

you leave your vehicle unattended.

Report suspicious activity to police, even if it does not involve your own vehicle. If you see suspicious activity occurring, report it.

### Break and enter

At approximately 2:15 a.m. Mar. 3, Wakaw RCMP received a report of a break and enter in the RM of Fish Creek, west of Wakaw. Investigation determined two males broke into a residence and several nearby outbuildings and stole approximately 10 firearms and some tools and electronics. No injuries were reported to police. The males then fled westbound on Hwy. 312 in a

black pickup truck. Officers issued a local advisory on the Saskatchewan Crime Watch Network to advise residents in the area of the incident to be on the lookout for the black truck and to report suspicious activity to police.

Wakaw RCMP continue to investigate with the assistance of the Saskatchewan RCMP's Forensic Identification Services. Anyone with information should call Wakaw RCMP at 306-233-5810. 

## Micro and Macro of the Boreal Forest on display at Gallery on 3rd

A rather unique exhibit is on display at the Gallery on 3rd in Watrous. Through the Organization of Saskatchewan Arts Councils (OSAC) Arts on the Move Program, Micro and Macro of the Boreal Forest is being featured at the Gallery during a portion of March.

With artists Greg Allen and Jeff Meldrum, Micro and Macro of the Boreal Forest serves to juxtapose two very different yet integrally connected elements of the forest ecosystem, the microbiome found along the boulders inhabiting Canadian shield lakes and the bears and ungulates which that microbiome ultimately nourishes and sustains.

Allen paints the intricacies of the algae, lichen and moss which over time slowly come to cover the rocks and boulders found along the shoreline of boreal forest lakes while Meldrum sets up camera traps to capture bears, elk and deer interacting with his artistic interventions in the landscape.

By showcasing the two works together, the artists hope to prompt viewers to consider the complexity of the ecology, systems both big and small, while fostering an appreciation for the aesthetics bound within the boreal forest.

## MOTUS O - The Prisoner of Tehran

An incredible story based on the book Prisoner of Tehran and told through a unique performance will be centre stage in Watrous.

In partnership with the Organization of Saskatchewan Arts Councils (OSAC) and the Watrous and Area Arts Council, the Mar. 27 event is part of the 2022-'23 Stars for Saskatchewan Concert Series.

Based on the book of the same name, Prisoner of Tehran is a collaboration between Iranian born writer/speaker Marina Nemat

and MOTUS O. This unique performance piece is a synthesis of theatre, video and storytelling that swims in a landscape of movement brushing the themes of oppression, persecution, survival and most of all HOPE.

After the Islamic Revolution of 1979, Marina was arrested at the age of 16 and spent more than two years in Evin, a political prison in Tehran, where she was tortured and came very close to execution. She came to Canada in 1991 and has called it home ever since.

Marina's book, Prisoner of Tehran, has been pub-

lished in 28 other countries and is an international best-seller. After each show a question and answer period will take place.

Prisoner of Tehran has toured much of Canada including performances to

over 10,000 high school students. Following the evening event at the Watrous Civic Centre, the tour has eight more stops within the province as part of a 15 Saskatchewan community tour.
