## SLGA building in Watrous sold following successful liquor permit bid

The building that housed Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority's (SLGA) Retail Inc. liquor store in Watrous has a new owner. Following bids for the liquor permit in February, the building on 2nd Ave. E. in Watrous was then put up for sale.

According to SLGA, an offer of \$450,000 has been accepted from Cost Cannabis Inc. for the Watrous facility. The offer comes the same time as one accepted in the community of Biggar with the total purchase price for both pegged at \$800,000. Along with those two properties, SLGA has now accepted offers on properties located in the communities of Esterhazy, LaRonge, Buffalo Narrows, Creighton, Carlyle, Humboldt, Moosomin, and Fort Qu'Appelle. To date, total property sales have amounted to \$3,255,000.

"I am pleased with the level of interest we have seen in these buildings," Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority Minister Lori Carr said. "Selling the properties is another step in the process to wind down SLGA Retail Inc. and the proceeds from the sales will also support important public services across the province."

SLGA Retail Inc. owned 19 of its 34 store

properties and stated five of the buildings will be repurposed for other government organizations.

Meanwhile, the retail liquor store permits associated with SLGA Retail Inc. were sold through a public auction in February 2023. Regarding the successful bidders of each location, SLGA indicated that applicant names for liquor permits are not considered public until a permit is issued.

In the case of the Watrous liquor permit, 14 bidders and 170 bids reached a final total of \$724,500. While not the highest bid nor the lowest of the 35 permits up for grabs in the province, overall winning bids for the 35 permits totalled \$45,077,800, ranging from \$450,000 in Carlyle to \$3,270,000 in LaRonge.

Conducted through McDougall Auctions during the majority of February, following the purchase, SLGA said winning bidders commence the application process for the retail store permit. Prospective retailers must meet all SLGA licensing requirements to hold a permit. Timelines for issuance of permits will vary, depending how soon prospective retailers submit and meet all application requirements, secure locations, hire staff and make other

preparations to open for business. Bid amounts must also be fully paid before a permit is issued.

Successful bidders have up to 18 months to obtain their permit and open for business.

According to the provincial government, in 2018-'19, profits for its SLGA Retailers were \$9.4 million and in 2021-'22, they had declined to \$3.2 million. SLGA Retail's projected net income for 2022-'23 was pegged at \$395,000 so in order to maintain profitability, the government indicated many of the stores needed to either be relocated or physically adapted to better meet customer needs. Because of that and with the dip in profits, the decision was made by government to decommission its stores and complete a transition of liquor retailing to the private sector.

Along with Watrous, other SLGA stores ceasing operations are located in: Assiniboia, Biggar, Buffalo Narrows, Carlyle, Creighton, Esterhazy, Estevan, Fort Qu'Appelle, Humboldt, La Loche, La Ronge, Meadow Lake, Melfort, Moose Jaw, Moosomin, Nipawin, North Battleford, Prince Albert (two), Regina (six), Saskatoon (five), Swift Current, Weyburn, and Yorkton.



### Wall of smoke

# M & M Small Engine geared towards service and selection

What first started out as a hobby has since revved up into a full-time career for one Watrous resident. Taking pride in the service he provides and the ability to fix essentially any small engine, Mark Herauf has transformed his garage at 107 4th Ave. W. into his own service centre.

Tinkering with small engines in the late 1980s before getting certified a few years later, Herauf found his passion and

launched his own business in the early 2000s. Relocating from Lanigan to Watrous in 2012, Herauf opened M & M Small Engine in 2013 as a part-time venture and then last summer, made the decision to operate full time.

"I have been pretty booked up," shared Herauf who is the authorized service depot in the area for Briggs, the local Ducar rep and the authorized warranty person for Echo and Bearcat.


Having the ability to manufacture his own parts while also selling new parts for all small engines,

the journeyman machinist said he has the ability to fix essentially anything related to small engines. "I can repair mowers, tillers, generators, pumps, lawn tractors, snowblowers and auger engines as well. I am also able to rebuild Tecumseh engines, something that is not made anymore and are required in some machines that I service."

In addition to repairs, Herauf sells refurbished equipment and can order new machines related to lawn and garden, snowblowers, and car parts. "When it comes to

pricing I am comparable to the city and I have the ability to pretty much get anything in. The new machines I sell, about 99 percent of them I am able to service. That way if there ends up being a problem or there is a warranty issue, people can bring it to me instead of going to the city."

Wanting to serve the local area, Herauf has also done the odd service call but the owner of M & M Small Engine added he mainly

works on equipment at his garage. With that demand increasing, last year Mark made the decision to purchase a lot across the back alley from his current location and is planning to one day build a new facility. "That is the future site of M & M Small Engine. As things continue to grow, I am hoping to construct a new building as my shop."

Until then, Herauf continues to utilize his service centre, bringing in additional equipment

to help make things run smoothly. "I just got a hoist that I installed and that will help me get at different parts of the machines I work on."

Despite no real set hours, for those wanting to have Herauf help them out, his phone is usually on or he can be found working away in his service centre. "If you can't get me on my phone, just drive by down the alley. Lots of times I am here working on something and can't hear my phone."



# Official ceremony to be held for new trail

After welcoming the first walkers along the new walking trail from Watrous to Manitou Beach Oct. 21, 2022, provincial dignitaries will be in attendance during the morning May 25 to signify the final phase of the project.

While the ribbon was cut during a soft opening with the mayors of Watrous and Manitou Beach in October, Ron Ediger of Melron Services Ltd., who covered the expenses and work on the trail said regrettably those from the provincial level were unable to attend. “I wanted to have the trail open before winter so that people could enjoy it before the snow came. Unfortunately we were unable to have everyone in attendance when we cut the ribbon but we have Deputy Premier and local MLA Donna Harpauer and Minister of Highways Jeremy Cockrill committed to coming here at 10:30 a.m.

May 25.”

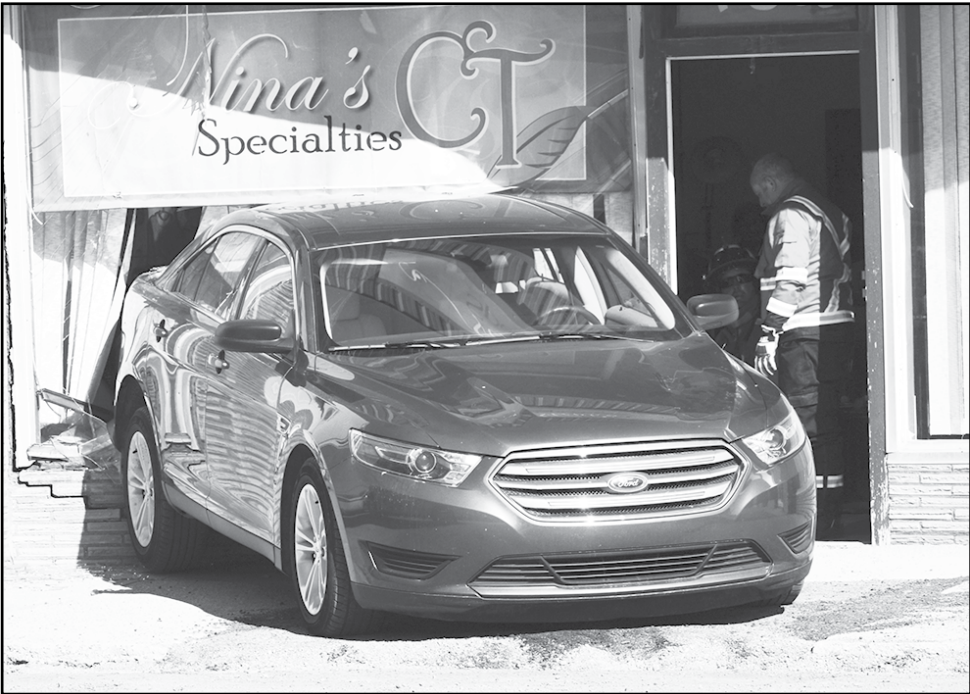
Planning to officially celebrate the completion of the approximately three kilometre trail that goes from Watrous to Manitou Beach, Ediger said the idea was aimed at bringing two communities together while offering a safe place to walk, bike and enjoy the outdoors.

“It has been used quite a bit since we finished it late last year. Now that the snow is gone and the warm weather has arrived, I am sure more people will be taking advantage of it.”

Sharing how grateful he is of the Watrous Rotary Club, the RM of

Morris, communities of Watrous and Manitou Beach, the four families (Alcock, Knezacek, Hayter, and Reichert) who donated benches along the trail, Rick and Margaret McDonald for donating a portion of land, the Ministry of Highways and his crew at Melron Services Ltd. for helping make the trail a reality, Ediger said, “This was my privilege to be able to make this trail. This year will mark 26 years ago when I came here with a single backhoe and this community and the area

### Quick Cherry Parfait Desserts

has been so good to us. I wanted to give back to those who have supported me over those years and felt this was a good way of doing that.”

Packed and sand sealed with benches installed at various points along the way, Ediger remarked, “This trail goes to show that we can put the town and village together, and joining with the Rotary Walking Trail, we can bring the two communities together as one.”

Extending northeast from the first trail originally completed by the Watrous Rotary, the newest path goes past a gazebo toward the Watrous Cemetery. Walkers veer off the gravel road as the new trail runs along a corner of the cemetery to the main gates. From there, walkers cross Hwy. 365 to the other side of the trail. Once there, the trail is situated alongside Hwy. 365 and heads toward Manitou Beach. Reaching the turnoff to Murray Disc Golf, Ediger extended a portion of that gravel road wrapping around a slough and into a field.

At the nearby farmyard, a path was cut adjacent

to some hedges near the highway. A six foot barrier was installed on the other side to allow privacy from the yard site. The trail then continues alongside the highway going between a pasture and signs at the entrance to the Resort Village of Manitou Beach. Creating walking space near another home, the trail goes through a treed area before reaching the Manitou and District Regional Park Campground. With room around some hedges, the trail leads walkers by the entrance of the park and then out in front of the drive-in and eventually comes to a conclusion at Lakeview Avenue, near the Resort Village of Manitou Beach's office and Manitou Mini Golf.

Enjoying watching people utilize the new trail, Ediger said, “I encourage anyone who would like to come out and officially commemorate the trail to stop by where it begins near the Resort Village of Manitou Beach office Thursday morning, May 25 at 10:30 a.m. It will be a great day and a day for celebrating seeing this project completed.”

“Did you know that dolphins sleep with one eye open?” It's true.

They do so because they can only let one side of their brain sleep at a time. When the left side of the brain sleeps, the right eye

will close, and vice versa. This is not some weird, ambidextrous stunt they are pulling. Rather, it is because they must always remain partially conscious to remind themselves to breathe.

You see, dolphins, unlike most sea creatures, are not fish. They are mammals. As such, they need to surface regularly to take in air. And for dolphins, breathing is not automatic or reflexive the way it is for humans. “In other words,” say the experts at us.whales.org, “Dolphins have to actively decide when to breathe. . . . RCMP Major Crimes took carriage of the investigation. Since then, Major Crimes has been working to identify the remains, in conjunction with Watrous RCMP, Saskatchewan RCMP's Forensic Identification Services, Police Dog Services, the Saskatchewan Coroners Service and a forensic anthropologist.

In March 2022, investigators enlisted the assistance of a forensic genealogy firm. Using DNA, the experts were able to determine the deceased individual had closely-related relatives in the Red Deer, Alta. area.

Further investigation by Major Crimes determined the remains likely belonged to a woman from Red Deer, who was last seen there in January 2021. She had not been reported missing to police. In January 2023, Saskatchewan RCMP Forensic Identification Services conclusively determined the human remains belong to Cassandra Jorquera, who would have been 27 years old at the time of her death. Her family has been notified.

Major Crimes continues to investigate the circumstances of Cassandra's death, which investigators have determined is suspicious in

nature.

Investigators want to speak with anyone who has information about Cassandra's death, or has knowledge of her activities in and around January 2021. Cassandra often frequented Red Deer and is known to have been there in January 2021. She also visited Grande Prairie periodically. Her connection to Saskatchewan is unknown at this time.

Investigators released her photo and description to help advance this investigation. Cassandra was approximately 5'5" and 110 lbs. She had shoulder-length dark brown hair and brown eyes. Her family describes her as having "beautiful" teeth.



"Since February 2021, we've worked diligently to identify the person located deceased. We now know it's Cassandra. Our work continues: we need to retrace all of her steps in January 2021," said Sgt. Ryan Boogaard from Saskatchewan RCMP Major

Crimes. "I know it was some time ago, but we're asking people - particularly in the Red Deer area - to take a look at her picture and think back. Did you know Cassandra? Did you speak with her or encounter her in the weeks after New Year's 2021? You may have a piece of the puzzle that will help us determine what happened to her in those final weeks of her life."

Anyone with information on Cassandra's death, or whereabouts in and around January 2021, should contact Saskatchewan RCMP Major Crimes at 639-625-4535. Information can also be submitted anonymously by contacting Saskatchewan Crime Stoppers at 1-800-222-TIPS (8477) or www.saskcrimestoppers.com.
