SaskWater relocating its operations from Watrous

After working out of Watrous for a number of years, a recent decision by SaskWater will see its local area operations relocated. SaskWater Manager, Corporate Communications Courtney Mihalicz said the transition from the company's current location at 102 – 13th Ave. E. in Watrous to a different community is expected to be completed by the summer of 2020.

"A decision was made to relocate staff to more efficiently manage resources and support the work required in that area," stated Mihalicz who added SaskWater currently has several locations around the province including in Hanley where the three employees from the Watrous site will be based out of.

"The (Watrous) closure will not impact services in the area. Staff in that area are responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Saskatoon Southeast Water Supply canal system and that work will continue as per normal operations."

SaskWater, as a commercial Crown utility, has had a presence in Watrous since 2002 and prior to that, Mihalicz noted the Saskatchewan Water Supply Board, which became the Saskatchewan Water Corporation in 1984 operated in Watrous as well. Despite the company's longevity within the community, once the transition does take place, the ATCO building at the current site in Watrous will be moved to Hanley while the shop and lot will remain. Currently the future of the shop and lot has yet to be determined.

The news of the relocation is the second such announcement involving Watrous as the provincial government announced last month the Saskatchewan Ministry

of Agriculture's extension services in Watrous are being sent to Humboldt in March 2020. With five employees in Watrous from that sector able to continue their roles in Humboldt, Agriculture Minister David Marit said, "Establishing an office in Humboldt allows us to maximize the positive impact of our extension services on the agriculture community. We will continue to serve our clients in the Watrous region from our Humboldt office,

while expanding specialists' reach by being co-located with Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation in a larger centre."

The move from Watrous to Humboldt will bring the ministry and Saskatchewan Crop Insurance Corporation services together in the same community "enhancing the services offered by both organizations to producers in the region."

AHL All-Star Classic to feature pair with roots to Imperial

The community of Imperial will be well represented at this year's American Hockey League All-Star Classic in Ontario, Calif. later this month. After it was announced that head coach of the Hartford Wolf Pack Kris Knoblauch will be the coach of the Atlantic Division, the rosters for each team were later revealed and goalie for the Milwaukee Admirals, Connor Ingram was named to the Central Division team.

Both Knoblauch and Ingram hail from Imperial and both were also drafted by NHL teams. Knoblauch who is the eldest of the two has since wrapped up his playing career and is taking the path of coaching. Behind the bench as a head coach, he advanced to the Memorial Cup during his major junior coaching career with Kamloops and Erie, won OHL Coach of the Year accolades with Erie and now during his first year as the head coach of the Wolf Pack, the team sits in first place in the Atlantic Division through 36 games.

Meanwhile, Ingram is competing for the affiliate of the Nashville Predators and has helped the Admirals to a record of 24-6-4-2 for first place in the Central Division. Splitting time with fellow net-minder Troy Grosenick, Ingram has a record of 11-3-4 so far this season.

Ingram sat fifth overall in the AHL

with a goals against average of 2.12. His 11 wins on the year put him tied with seven others, six behind Mikhail Berdin who has played 32 games. In net for 19 games so far, Ingram's current save percentage of .929 and his goals against average of 2.12 are his best to date. Last year with the Syracuse Crunch, a year in which he also made the All-Star Classic, Ingram played in 22 games and had a record of 14-7, a save percentage of .922 and a goals against average of 2.12. The year prior, also with Syracuse, Ingram suited up for 35 games, had an overall record of 20-11-2, a save percentage of .914 and a goals against average of 2.33.

While Knoblauch and Ingram will be representing different divisions at this year's All-Star Classic this marks the first time the pair will be at the AHL event at the same time. However, it is not the first occurrence where both Imperial natives will be in the spotlight together. With Kris behind the bench as an assistant coach and Connor one of the goalies, the duo helped Team Canada capture a silver medal at the 2017 IIHF World Junior Championship.

As for the AHL All-Star Classic, the skills competition takes place Sunday, Jan. 26. In that event, it will pit the all-stars from the two Eastern Conference divisions against those from the two Western Conference divisions in seven skills

events.

Then for the All-Star Challenge Jan. 27, the all-stars have been divided into four teams, one representing each of the league's four divisions. The teams will participate in a round-robin three-on-three tournament featuring six games of 10 minutes each. The two teams with the best records at the end of the round-robin will face off for the championship, a six-minute game also played at three-on-three.

Armed robbery at North Battleford

Jan. 4 at 1 a.m., Battlefords RCMP received a call of an armed robbery at a business located on the 1700 block of 100th Street, North Battleford. A lone male subject entered the business brandishing a weapon and threatening the employee to provide cash. Once the male obtained the cash that was demanded he fled the business running west bound across 100th Street towards 99th Street and further west out of view.

The suspect was described as being tall, thin, wearing a black short-sleeved jacket and a grey hoodie underneath, as well as black jeans and black shoes.

Battlefords RCMP is requesting business or community members with video surveillance to check their systems between the hours of 12:30 and 1:30 a.m. to see if they may have captured this suspect on camera which would assist in identifying them.

House fire in Melville

Jan. 4 at approximately 1:30 a.m., Melville RCMP responded to the report of a fire at a residence on 6th Ave. in Melville.

When officers arrived on scene, the house was fully engulfed in flames and the local fire response team was attempting to extinguish the fire.

When it was safe for emergency personnel to enter the residence, an adult male who passed away was located inside. The Saskatchewan Coroners Service has ordered a forensic autopsy.

At this time, the cause of the fire is not believed to be suspicious in nature.

Melville RCMP continues to investigate with the assistance of the Saskatchewan Coroners Service and a Provincial Fire Scene Examiner.

Motor vehicle collision southeast of Weyburn

Jan. 5 at approximately 6 a.m., Weyburn RCMP responded to reports of a serious motor vehicle collision on Hwy. 39 approximately two kilometres southeast of Weyburn.

A semi truck and a pickup truck collided head on in the southbound lane.

The driver and sole occupant of the pickup truck, a 19-year-old male, passed away at the scene. The driver and sole occupant of the semi, a 34-year-old male, was taken to hospital in Regina with undetermined injuries.

Weyburn RCMP and an RCMP Traffic Reconstructionist are continuing to investigate the circumstances

of this collision.

Yorkton RCMP seize over 227,000 illegal cigarettes

Yorkton Provincial General Investigation Section (GIS), in partnership with Kamsack RCMP, the Saskatchewan RCMP Criminal Analytical Section and the Saskatchewan Ministry of Finance, have laid charges in connection to illegal tobacco sales out of a business in Pelly, Sask.

A four month investigation resulted in the execution of six search warrants in Pelly and Hyas, Sask. Jan. 2. Investigators seized approximately 227,000 illegal cigarettes, 25 pounds of loose-leaf tobacco and approximately \$1,800 in Canadian currency.

Brian Clough, Brittany Clough and Andrew Popoff, of the Hyas and Pelly area, were arrested and are facing the following charges: Possession for the purpose to sell unstamped tobacco products and raw leaf tobacco, contrary to Section 121.1(1) of the Criminal Code; Sell, offer for sale, or possess and unstamped tobacco products, contrary to Section 32(1) of the Excise Act; Importation of tobacco without a required notice, contrary to Section 8(1)(a) of the Tobacco Tax Act; Sale, possession, storage or transportation of tobacco that is not marked in the prescribed manner, contrary to Section 11(2) of the Tobacco Tax Act; and Sale, possession, storage or transportation of tobacco that is not marked in the prescribed manner, contrary to Section 11(2) of the Tobacco Tax Act.

- Warren Vandenamee, Langenburg (Saskatchewan Region) – two-year term;
- Jordan Barry, Saskatoon (Saskatoon Region) – two-year term;
- Norm Fisher, Saskatoon (Saskatoon Region) – one-year term;
- Jeff Stewart, Saskatoon (Saskatoon Region) – two-year term;
- Lane Boghean, Regina (Regina Region) – two-year term; and
- Sara McKinley, Regina (Regina Region) – two-year term.

The SRA Board of Directors took effect Jan. 1, 2020 and will be installed at the SRA Annual General Meeting in March 2020.

Terrible destruction

The images have been horrific, devastation unbelievable as fires continue to burn in Australia.

According to a number of reports last week, as many as one billion animals may have been killed in Australia's wild-fires since September; 800 million in the worst-hit state of New South Wales.

Some of those animals including kangaroos and koalas are helpless as fires ravage the area. The late Steve Irwin's family has reportedly helped to rescue over 90,000 animals, many of which were endangered by the ongoing Australian bush fires.

But it is not just animals who have tragically perished as at least 26 people have been killed and almost 3,000 homes destroyed according to npr. CNN cited the blazes which have been destroying the landscape for months have burned nearly 18 million acres of land.

Then on Jan. 10, it was reported by npr that a pair of massive bushfires in southeastern Australia merged into a megafire, engulfing some 2,300 square miles - a blaze more than three times as large as any known fire in California. The Sydney Morning Herald noted the merged fire measures nearly 1.5 million acres, one of 135 bushfires in Australia's southeast.

Since the fires started, two dozen people have now been accused of deliberately lighting some of the fires and more than 30,000 people have reportedly protested in Sydney denouncing the government's handling of the crisis and to call for action on climate change.

Here in Saskatchewan, people have been deployed to help with the efforts in Australia while various organizations in Australia are seeking help via donation. On its website, USA Today listed a number of places people can donate to help with efforts including fire departments in Victoria and New South Wales. People can also go to the Victorian Government's website as they have partnered with Bendigo Bank and The Salvation Army to establish a fund for affected families and communities. The Australian Red Cross, Australia Zoo Wildlife Hospital (wildlifewarriors.org.au) and others are also accepting funds.

While I can find myself easily complaining about it being -30°C, seeing the images of devastation in Australia, I am quickly reminded at how many times I take living in Saskatchewan for granted. If you feel led to donate, please do as the situation continues to remain dire for many.

Pour one-eighth cup baking soda inside the bag and shake. Seal the bag and place it in the freezer for one week. Shake out baking soda, grab a cup of coffee and enjoy your fresh smelling books.

I make homemade egg rolls and as they fry they fall apart and the filling escapes into the cooking oil. How can I prevent egg rolls from opening during cooking? How does one reheat egg rolls so that they remain crispy and not soggy? Vince

Dear Vince,

Begin by brushing the egg roll wrapper with a bit of egg white (I call this kitchen glue). Close the wrapper and press. When oil is hot, use tongs to carefully hold the seam of the egg roll into the oil to seal it. After a few seconds drop the egg roll in the oil, the seam should remain closed. To reheat egg rolls, bake in the oven at 350° for five minutes. Broil for one minute or until wrappers are crispy.

Dear Reena,

My indoor walker is leaving black marks on my carpet. Is there something I can coat the wheels with to prevent this? Luther

Dear Luther,

Tires are black due to the chemical "carbon black," which is a combination of various forms of tar and vegetable oil. There is nothing official that removes the residual chemical. Some people have great success by wiping the wheels with either rubbing alcohol or household ammonia. Other people enlist a friend to run the walker

I picked up a few old books at an auction; the books carry a musty odour that I am unable to destroy. What can I do to take away the stink? Arthur

Dear Arthur,

Place the books inside of a sealable plastic bag.

over snow on the driveway which wears off some of the black residue (dry well). The good news is that over time; the marks should become considerably less. Remove any marks on vinyl flooring with a rubber eraser. Clean marks on carpet with dish soap and water. If the walkers had straight legs instead of wheels, you would have the option to slit rubber or tennis balls and fit them over the feet of the walker.

Look What’s Cooking by Laura Novecosky

Peaches and Cream Dessert

Ingredients:

- 2 cups graham wafers
- 1/2 cup butter (or margarine)
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 brick of cream cheese
- 1/3 cup brown sugar
- 2 cans peaches (14 oz. each or 3 smaller cans of peaches)
- 2 tbsp. cornstarch
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 cups whipping cream

Directions:

Combine graham crumbs, brown sugar and half the melted butter. Reserve half a cup, press the remainder in a 9 x 13 pan. Drain peaches, reserve two cups of liquid. Combine the two cups of juice with 1/2 cup of sugar and the cornstarch. Microwave this on high for one minute, stir, and microwave on high for one more minute. If it is not quite thick enough, microwave another 30 seconds, making sure to stir this each time you microwave. Cool and add the peaches. Beat cream cheese with the remaining one cup of sugar. Beat whipping cream until thick and fold in the cream cheese mixture. Spread half of this over the cooled graham crust, add the peaches layer and top with the remaining cream cheese mixture. Sprinkle with reserved crumb mixture.

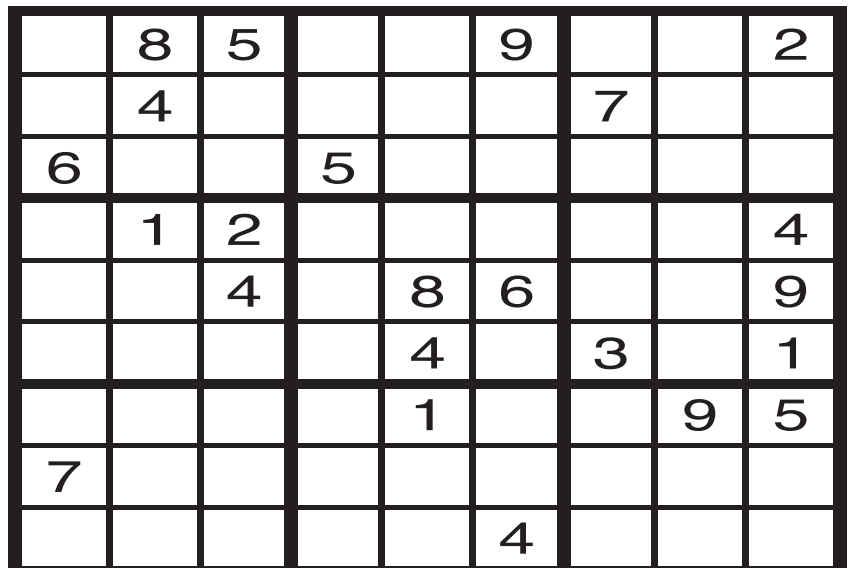

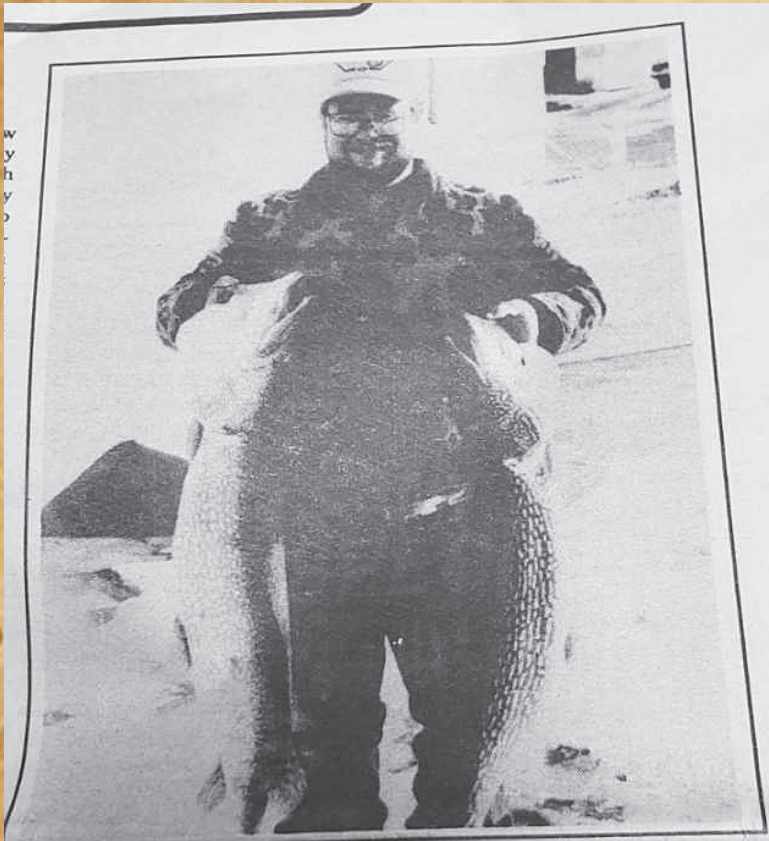
WES Student of the Month

Province sends help to Australia

The Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) sent three more wildland fire management staff to New South Wales, Australia, for a deployment of 38 days.

These specialists join eight other SPSA staff already in Australia helping crews battle bushfires. They will relieve those that deployed at the beginning of December as part of a Canadian contingent co-ordinated by the Canadian Interagency Forest Fire Centre (CIFFC).

"Australia is in dire need of help and the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency is more than willing to answer that call," SPSA President Marlo Pritchard said. "As a province well versed in evacuations and fighting wildfires, the province of Saskatchewan sends not only its assistance but also its heartfelt condolences to those affected by this tragedy."

This is the third Saskatchewan deployment of Canadian firefighters to Australia under the Exchange of Wildland Fire Management Resources Agreement. Canada has called on Australian firefighters four times since 2015.

The original group has been helping to manage wildland fire incidents in the areas around Glen Innes, Grafton, Casino and Kempsey in the northeastern part of the state.

The National Resource Sharing Centre in Melbourne requested assistance from Canadian wildfire agencies to fight bushfires along the east coast of Australia. Canadian fire management staff are filling operational, planning and aviation roles.

A severe and early fire season in eastern Australia has led to fatalities, property loss and the destruction of large areas of New South Wales and Queensland.

Saskatchewan is a member of the CIFFC. When appropriate, Canadian provincial wildfire agencies export fire-fighting resources at the request of other jurisdictions through mutual aid resource sharing agreements.
