Our dear Auntie and sister, Alexandra, has died. We were so blessed to

have her in our lives for 96 years. Her precious life ended Friday, April 11, 2025. Alexandra was born on the family farm in the Venn District (Watrous area of south central Saskatchewan).

Alexandra received her elementary education at Ridgford Rural School and completed high school at Saskatoon Technical Collegiate. At the age of 19, Alexandra became a member of an Ukrainian Catholic Order of Nuns, Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate. She received a teaching certificate from Saskatoon Teachers College and taught in Catholic schools in Saskatchewan and Ontario. She later received a Bachelor's degree in Journalism from Carleton University in Ottawa.

After 21 years with the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate, Alexandra left the order and worked as a

journalist in Northern Ontario, small towns and then at the Northern Miner in Toronto. The last phase of her career was at Canada Revenue from which she retired in 2002.

Alexandra is predeceased by her parents Peter (1988) and Tekla (1999, nee Kuz) Worobec, brothers Steve (2008), and Mervin (2018), sisters Annie Tymchak (2015), Olga Swystun (1984), Mary McDade (2012), Helen Shreve (2018), Leona Redding (1998), and Margaret Worobec (2014). She is survived by her brother Austin and sister Nellie Collins. Alexandra will be remembered by 37 nieces and nephews who loved her dearly. Alexandra loved her nephews and nieces, Sheltie Collie, and told us about her farm dogs Chubby and Sporty.

She loved her walks in the fall, and brought the leaves home to enjoy over the winter. We would chat and she would give me "The Fall Colour Report." Part of her daily routine was a walk to the health food store, with a stop at a local coffee shop where she enjoyed her pecan butter tart, a coffee and the newspaper.

I am so honoured and grateful to have called her my auntie. We were truly blessed to have had such loving care for Alexandra from Deborah, Maurine and Jocelyn.

Alexandra was loved. Burial has taken place.
