Five Lions to be Inducted into Saskatchewan Hall of Fame at Provincial Convention

At the upcoming Convention in Saskatoon at the end of October, five Lions from the province will be honoured with an official induction into the Saskatchewan Lions Hall of Fame. The honourees from 5SKN are Lions Vic Juba and 2nd VDG Nancy Bonyai. 5SKS honourees are Lions Robert Abernathy, Rodney Knight, and PDG Jim Vermeersch.

PDG Jim of the Carlyle District Lions Club shared with the *Lion's Pride* that he finds it truly humbling to now be able to say he's a member of the Hall of Fame.

Lion Jim's journey with the Lions began in 1993 with the Carlyle Lions. He noted, "At the time, I simply wanted to join an organization that would allow me to meet new people in the community ... I soon found out that Lions provided me so much more. I remember the first 'aha' moment – those moments in time when you are able to say to yourself "this is what being a *Lion* is about".

Jim was referring to a donation that the Club made shortly after he joined; a family had just lost everything in a house fire and the funds had a tremendous positive impact on the family who received it. "I knew then I had become part of a very unique service organization and I have continued to be awed and inspired by what Lions do in their communities and around the world."

Jim says he feels privileged to have served with two Lions Clubs – Carlyle and Estevan – and to have had the opportunity to serve as a 5SKS District Governor (2019-2020). "The experiences I have had and the people I have met from around the world have been incredible.

I am proud of the service work we do in our small community of Carlyle."



Lions Foundation of Canada Difference Campaign Needs Your Help! NOW!!

As many of our readers know, the *Difference Campaign* for a new Dog Guide facility in Oakville, Ontario has hit a snag. A delay in bank funding (it's still coming!) has resulted in construction being suspended, pending the infusion of \$20 million. This money is needed by October 31st or the entire project is in jeopardy – a scary thought with that deadline date not very far away!!

It is hoped that Canadian Lions Clubs and individuals can make up a quarter (\$5 million) of this amount and so far, nearly \$2 million has been raised by over 600 Canadian Lions Clubs. The rest is expected from corporate and even government sources.

Clubs and individuals who have pledged their donations in the future are encouraged to donate and maybe even increase the amounts ...NOW! Clubs and individuals who have already donated are being asked to consider adding a little more ...NOW! *Every amount helps*. 


Melville Lions Send Away 300 Pairs of Recycled Eyeglasses

On September 22, approximately 300 pairs of used eyeglasses and a pair of hearing aids were dropped off at CNIB Regina

The Club thanks Melville City Hall, Royal Bank, and Bank of Montreal for providing collection sites. Cornerstone Credit Union would usually have a collection box but their renovations prevented them from doing so with this last batch.

The Lions packed the glasses, and once they arrive in Regina, they are packed for transport by Lion Terry Parson, from Regina Lakeside Lions. The glasses are then shipped to Calgary where Lion volunteers at the Canadian Lions Eyeglass Recycling Centre (CLERC) wash, sort, repair and grade them before sending them overseas to people in need.


Middle Lake Lions to Host Supper Fundraiser for Local Cattle Breeder






