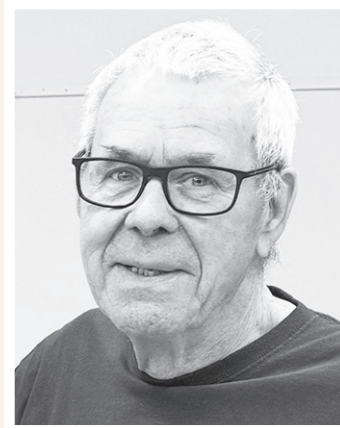


# OBITUARY
