Aside from all the great work we do in our local communities, Lions has many other worthwhile causes individuals and Clubs can support including:

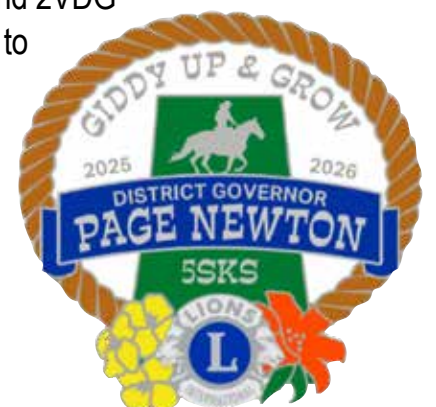

Lions Project Maple Leaf; What Should Know

A project of Lions of Alberta Foundation, Lions Project Maple Leaf is an activity for Canadian Lions Clubs and an opportunity to demonstrate to your community how proud you are to be a Canadian and a Lion. Within your communities, you can involve your Club by contacting local school officials requesting permission to visit schools in order to present a flag of Canada and a Lions Project Maple certificate (in English or French) to Grade 1 students.

Simply determine the number of flags and certificates that your Club will need to present to the students, then complete the NEW order form, attach payment, and mail to the address on the form. Please remember to include an email address so that a Canada Post tracking number can be provided to your Club.

Prepare for your visit – plan to wear something that identifies you as a Lion. Plan to tell the students who you are; provide your Lions Club name, share details about what Lions do within their communities and abroad, speak about the importance of Canada Day and our country's flag.

Things to remember: Be positive; present flags; present certificates which the teacher(s) have printed the student name on; encourage the students to have a bit of a discussion.

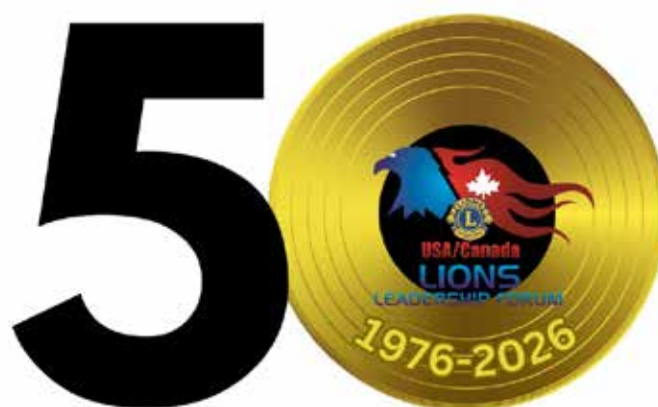

PRINCE ALBERT LIONS DONATE

\$7,700 to Area Elementary Schools

11 Total Schools to Benefit!

The Prince Albert Lions Club recently donated \$700 to each of the 11 Prince Albert and area elementary schools.

Benefitting this year were: Arthur Pechey School, École Valois, École Vickers, École Holy Cross, John Diefenbaker School, Red Wing School, Riverside Community School, St. Catherine Catholic School, Vincent Massey School, West Central School, and W.J. Berezowsky School.

The donations were made possible through the funds received from clients during the Club's 2025 Operation Red Nose program during the holiday season. In its 13th year, Operation Red Nose – hosted by the Prince Albert Lions Club – provided 166 rides over the 10 nights of operation during the holiday season. Volunteers delivered a total 341 people safely home in their own vehicles.

Three Prince Albert Lions and 17 community volunteers put in over 600 hours during the season keeping the city streets safer. The volunteers drove over 2,500 kms taking people home, and \$5,200 was donated by the people who were grateful to get home safely.

Donations were also made by Diamond North Credit Union, Cornerstone Insurance, Econo Lumber, and Carlton Honda to assist with operating costs and for the program. 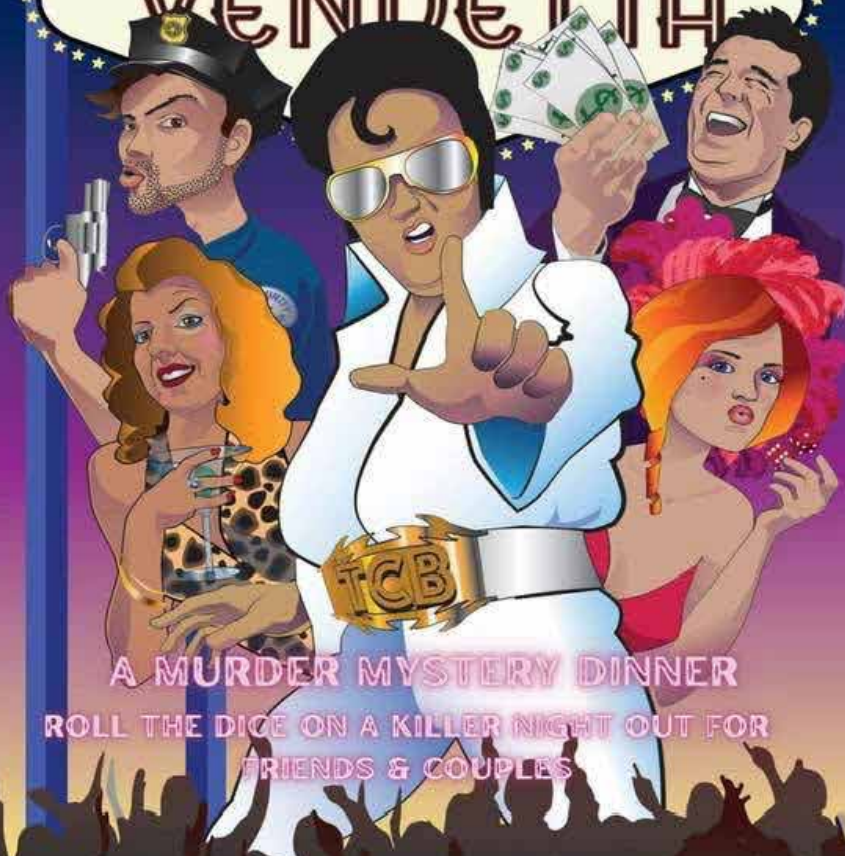

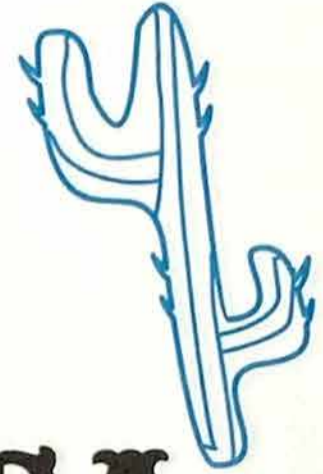
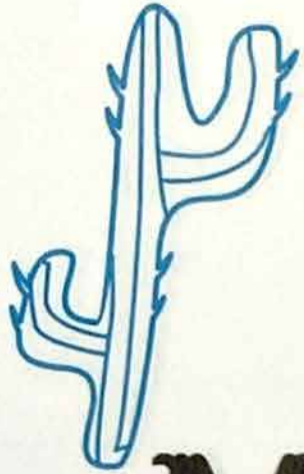
